### Portland Firm Cleared By Court of Appeals

San Francisco — (U.P.)—The Ninth District U.S. Court of Appeals has overruled the National Labor Relations Board in an unfair labor practice charge brought against Roberts Brothers, a leading Oregon department store.

The court refused to enforce an NLRB order requiring the firm to stop allegedly preventing employees from joining a union.

A local of the AFL Retail Clerks Union brought the original charge in 1952 during an organizational campaign when the company allegedly conducted a secret poll of employees on unionization.
