Foreign Aid Amendment Beaten Down in House
Washington—(U.P.)—The House Thursday beat down a move to bar U.S. aid to any country which subjects U.S. troops to foreign laws and courts as provided in treaties with the United States.
The amendment, sponsored by Rep. Hamer H. Budge (R-Ida.) to President Eisenhower's foreign aid bill, would have practically halted the aid program. The vote against it was 129 to 111 on a teller count.
The United States has so-called "status of forces" agreements with countries where U.S. troops are stationed.
The agreements subject Americans involved in criminal cases to the laws and courts of the country where they are stationed.

I am happy in the job. I get a lot of chuckles and many belly laughs out of it, and I get paid for it just as though it were work. But it isn't work. I haven't done an honest day's work since I was compelled to sell Topsy the Beautiful Sorrel.
Hi, Micky, I asked my boss, my real boss, isn't this so? She read the last paragraph and shook her head. Not entirely, she opined. On many of these beautiful spring days when you are pounding away at it and sixty or eighty of your cronies are gambling on the green, it looks like work. And sometimes when you see what some newspaper has done to your contribution, and you stamp around gritting your teeth and your son-in-law's (Lalla Rookh's husband is a dentist), you ain't chuckling! Dismissal Recommended On Suit Against Union

San Francisco—(U.P.)—Howard Myers, trial examiner for the National Labor Relations Board, has recommended dismissal of a complaint against the CIO International Woodworkers of America after his hearing at Reedsport, Ore.
Myers' report and recommendation were filed with the NLRB which will make the final determination. The charge against the union was made originally by Henry J. Fircchau Jr., an employee of the Long Bell Bridge Mill at Reedsport who was discharged, allegedly for violating union rules.

Control Resumed by Argentine Cardinal

Buenos Aires, Argentina—(U.P.)—Santiago Luis Cardinal Copello has resumed control of the Roman Catholic hierarchy in Argentina on the heels of a government shakeup that could mean an early end to the bitter church-state controversy.
The 75-year-old archbishop of Buenos Aires and primate of Argentina has been unable to carry on his full duties recently because of illness. The Right Rev. Manuel Tota, who an auxiliary bishop of Buenos Aires, was acting head of the church, was deposed by the government June 15.

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—Sen. Allen J. Ellender (D-La.) reports he is preparing a bill designed to stamp out "manipulation" of wheat prices by speculators who also own or control grain-warehouses.
