Walking on Grass Forbidden in Moscow

London.—(U.P.)—A visiting delegation of Soviet farmers and agricultural officials was amazed to see Londoners walking on the grass in Hyde Park yesterday.

"In Moscow, it is forbidden to walk on the grass," said Alexander Mayat, Soviet deputy minister of agriculture.

He and his colleagues took photographs of the grass and the people walking on it. They also asked a scientist at the royal botanical gardens exactly what type of grass it is.

When Dr. Norman Bor, the assistant director, said it was festuca rubra and agrostis tenuis, the Russians carefully recorded the fact in their notebooks.

Mayat and his team of experts are visiting Britain as guests of the London News Chronicle, which admitted it got the idea from the Des Moines Register and Tribune.

Dear Dr. Brady:

I am expecting my third baby in a few weeks and I get panicky every time I think of delivery.

With the first, my husband brought me to the hospital and saw me after it was all over.

With the second I go panicky because the pains were so bad and I was alone in the room.

For this one we had selected a hospital where, we had heard, the husband was allowed to stay with his wife. But he wasn't there at the delivery because, they said, there was a state law that prohibited presence of the husband . . . I don't think God expects a woman to be alone . . .

The doctor, nurse or other persons who said there was or is a law that prohibits the husband from remaining at his wife's side whenever she wants him to be there lied to you, Ma'am. He or she assumed you must be a credulous customer, since you deliberately left your home to enter a blankety-blank institution to have your baby.

Home is the best and safest place to have a baby.

I have given this advice here dozens of times, but I'm afraid most of you—most of you misguided people brush it aside as a queer notion. You think you know more than I do about it—and your favorite trick specialist or clinic racketeer keeps you thinking that way.

Leaving the laboring patient alone is the kind of cruelty moldy lying-in institutions perpetrate on a good many unsophisticated patrons.

This poor soul adds a kind of pathetic apology—she hopes I won't consider her foolish—she's "just a normal individual who got so scared when left alone and is so fearful that it may happen again." Best way to make sure it won't happen again: Have your baby at home.

If anybody argues that you have the benefit of "antiseptic"

precautions and all the equipment that may be necessary in an emergency only in the hospital, tell him the first assumption is not supported by vital statistics and the second applies as well to the treatment of any ailment, injury or physical condition.
