The Bend center will now serve as an independent unit in the Western Air Defense command separate from Portland filter center. It is connected with 206 ground observer posts and centers in Portland and Sacramento, Calif., by "hot wires."

The Lane County Coroner's office said the accident occurred on the Siuslaw river some 15 miles east of Astoria. Duke's body was found by his supervisor in the middle of the road, about 260 feet behind the wrecked logging truck.

IT'S RHEUMATIZ. NOT RHEUMATISM

Still I can't flatter myself that it has had the

effect I hoped it would have on the 40,000,000 morons who believe three fourths of their everyday illnesses are due to drafts, insufficient clothing, dampness, sudden changes etc., and so have no scruples against infecting everyone who comes within conversational spray range.

In this column rheumatiz means physical degeneration of joint tissues. Can't stop here to explain what physical degeneration means, but you'll learn something about it by reading the Calcium & Rheumatiz pamphlet mentioned above.

Savings Bond Sale Records Said High

Jackson county has a "very good" chance of filling its 1955 savings bond sales quota, according to Morris B. Leonard Sr., county bond sales chairman.

Sales of series E and H bonds in Jackson county were \$603,460 for the first five months this year. This amounts to 47.8 per cent of the county quota for the year, Leonard said.

Jackson county's sales were "up considerably" from last year, Leonard added. For the same five-month period last year, the total was \$404,651. The county's June sales were \$85,165. "We are still running 52 per cent ahead on our quota," he said.

Leonard added that the savings bond popularity was due to security, ability to be cashed at any time, the 3 per cent interest, and quick maturing time.

The state of Oregon leads the nation in the per cent of increase of savings bonds sales for the first five months this year over the same period last year, Leonard said.

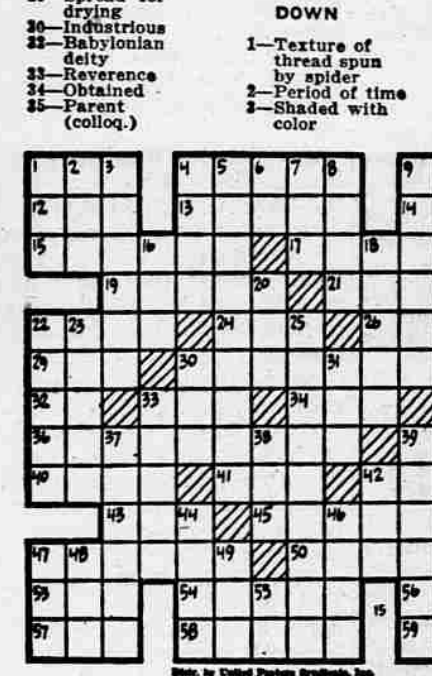
