Board Reminds Of Examinations For First Graders

Portland—Parents who have not already arranged for complete physical and dental examinations for children entering school for the first time this fall have been urged to do so by the state board of health.

Dr. Harold M. Erickson, state health officer, pointed out that Oregon school authorities ask parents for records of such medical and dental examinations at the time children first register for school.

He said that whenever possible such examinations should be done in the spring to allow time to complete immunization schedules and any corrective work which is indicated, but he emphasized that in any event the examinations should be completed before the children enroll.

Dr. Erickson also pointed out that many school districts require copies of birth certificates for all new admissions. These copies may be obtained by writing or visiting the state board of health, room 979, 1400 S. W. Fifth avenue, Portland 1. One dollar should accompany the request for each copy.

Information should include the full name of the child and the parents, and the date and place of birth, to enable state board of health staff members to search the records.
