IT'S ELEMENTARY, WATSON A lady has a rash on neck and back. She has spent the usual small fortune for treatment without benefit.

Phenomenal how such expenditures grow as time passes! Long ago when I was an honest doctor in Penn Yan this approach by a new patient filled me with dismay, for I found that in such cases I had just one crack at it, and if I failed, that was all. But then, on the other hand, even if by happy coincidence the trouble had run its course just as the patient came to me, the chances were the patient would decide it must have been a trivial ailment and I had a lot of cheek to charge \$2.

Please write on Allergy and Air Conditioning, the lady requests. Calcicaps, three a day, have done her tremendous good. No more does she have hay fever or asthma, except in an air-conditioned place. Thanking me for her extreme good health she is mine sincerely...

By quick reflex action I managed to hold back from the chucker most of the lady's letter. That extraordinary allergy with air conditioning — I must have read it too hurriedly. No, that's what the lady says—she is free from hay fever or asthma except in an air-conditioned place.

Normally we would expect an individual with allergy to be less miserable in air-conditioned environment than elsewhere, or at any rate not more miserable. But this lady asserts that she no longer has hay fever or asthma anywhere else!

Oh-h. Now I notice that the chucker didn't chew off the first part of the letter, about the rash on neck and back.

From its distribution it sounds like an allergic rash, caused by proximity to some plant such as primrose, or poisoning by hair dye or by dyed fur. If the hay fever or asthma is due to plant allergy, the plant responsible may be in or near the air-conditioned place.
