Swedish Blonde Wins Miss Universe Title

Long Beach, Calif. — (U.P.) — Hillivi Rombin, a graceful blonde college graduate from Sweden, captured the Miss Universe contest Friday night before a cheering crowd and was named the most beautiful girl in the world.

For the fourth year of the annual beauty pageant, the 11 judges chose a fresh-faced Nordic "Grace Kelly" type.

The 21-year-old beauty, a favorite to win the pearl-studded

crown from the beginning of the 11-day contest, nosed out 14 other semi-finalists from around the globe in the last leg of the judging.

Second place went to a bosomy blonde from El Salvador — Maribel Arrieta who had been dubbed the "Marilyn Monroe" of the affair by reporters covering the event.

Third was Miss Ceylon, Maureen Hingert, who won the crowd with her long, black hair and wide smiles.

Miss Germany, Margit Nunke, held a tiny blue teddy bear in her hand for good luck, and was judged fourth. Keiko Takahashi of Japan, a sloop-eyed girl with outstanding carriage and poise, won fifth place.

Miss Universe graduated from Upsala university in Sweden recently, and is engaged to an officer in the Swedish air force, Nils Benker.

"Yes, since last February," she said with cool poise as she sat on the winner's throne backstage in her red velvet queen's robe.

But marriage, she added, may have to wait. She said she would accept the \$250 weekly movie contract at Universal — International studio as part of her haul as the winner. She first will appear in a small role in "The Benny Goodman Story."

The most beautiful girl in the world is 5-foot, 7-inches tall and weighs 130 pounds. She has blue eyes and short, wavy hair. Her measurements are 36-23-36.

Miss Universe insisted, "Honestly, I didn't think I would win."

But the other contestants and the press had picked her the likely victor.

'Mentalist's' Act Current Feature At Local Theater

Jay Clarke, billed as "America's Foremost Mentalist", is presently playing at the Craterian theater.

Clarke, in a 10-minute act, answers questions put to him by the audience. They are written on slips of paper placed in a "gold-fish" bowl. Maintaining that he doesn't read the questions before going on stage, Clarke calls out the three initials he requires to be placed on the paper by the questioner — supposedly without mistake. When answered by a "yes" or "here," he proceeds to give parts of the question, and then answers it.

"Once in a while I'm very lucky," Clarke says of his work. He never guarantees any of his prophecies, but claims to get results a "good part of the time."

Clarke states that his audience never contains a "stoooge," or anyone who could collaborate with him on a fictitious question or answer. He offers \$1,000 and a lifetime pass to the show to anyone able to point out such a person.

Clarke uses what he calls "practical and book psychology," mixed with some ESP (extra sensory perception), a "little astrology," and "a lot of intuition," in his act.
