Irish Glassware With Marking Declared Rare

Old man O'Flaherty grabbed me by the arm while young Tom got a decanter of Irish whiskey and some glasses from the pantry.

"I won't drop the decanter... can't... That's why they have rings on the neck," he said, pointing to the rings of raised glass on the neck which he seized and began to pour. "See, your fingers can't slip."

The thought intrigued me. I had often wondered about the rings on decanter necks and complimented him on his logical explanation.

"That's the way it is with most Irish decanters," he said, "of the old ones such as we used to get in grandfather's time when the Irish exported vast quantities of glassware to the United States."

As he spoke, he picked up the decanter, tipped it to one side and pointed out the words on the bottom, "Cork Glass Co."

Recalling that much of the Irish glass was not marked—most of it, in fact—I asked if he knew the value of his piece.

"Chiefly sentimental," he said. "It couldn't be much else and stay around here for long." Tom agreed. I decided to say nothing more until I had looked it up.

What I learned next day was this. If you have any old decanters marked like the above, or with names such as "Waterloo Co., Cork," or "Cork Glass Co.," you're in. So far, since learning how rare his decanter is, O'Flaherty has refused two offers for it, one for \$500, and the other \$1,500.

EARLY ADVERTISING TOKENS LIKE SPANISH REALES

"This is my lucky day," said Ted, a coin dealer friend of mine. "It's due to a buy I had the good fortune to make yesterday. This one here," and he pointed to a small tray on which lay 10 Spanish two-reales pieces.

I looked at the coins carefully as they lay against the black velvet cover of the tray. They were ordinary pieces as such things go—nothing for anyone to get excited about, particularly a dealer such as Ted. In fact, they weren't particularly old, none of them being earlier than 1700.

"I bought the lot from an old fellow who came in yesterday. Gave him \$2 for them."

Local Paint Company Buys Doernbecher's Paint, Lacquer Plant

The Medford Paint Manufacturing corporation has acquired the complete manufacturing facilities of the paint and lacquer section of the Doernbecher Manufacturing Co. of Portland, It was reported Saturday.

Arrangements were completed after three members of the firm visited the Doernbecher plant. The entire machinery layout of the paint and lacquer plant will be moved to Medford in the near future.

The machinery purchased has a value of at least \$20,000, it was reported. It includes a modern three roller paint mill, a putty and paste mill, 10 heavy steel agitators ranging in capacity from 150-350 gallons each, mixers, pumps, filters, two 1000-gallon porcelain lined lacquer tanks, heavy duty, combustion proof motors, shafting, pulleys, hangars, belts, and other miscellaneous equipment.

Plans are now being drawn for a new, fire-proof addition to the present plant situated at 906 North Riverside ave. to house the new machinery, according to R. L. Taylor, president.

Modern Plant

"When completed and all machinery installed, Medford will have quite a complete and modern paint, varnish and lacquer plant, capable of supplying all kinds of paint, varnishes and lacquers in any quantity for both domestic and export trade," Taylor said. He added that negotiations are under way to furnish several furniture factories with lacquers and varnishes, and that representatives of the National Exporting association have inquired regarding prices

'Glass Rat' Helps in Liver Disease Study

Davis, Calif. —(UPI)—A "glass rat," whose only real internal organ is the liver, is being used here to study cirrhosis and other liver diseases.

A complex contraction of glass and rubber tubing is used to keep a rat's liver—about the size of a silver dollar—alive for up to 30 hours.

Dr. Ralph W. Brauer, German-born physiologist, is the inventor and the man who nicknamed the device "glass rat." Brauer is head of the pharmacology branch of the naval radiological defense laboratory, San Francisco. He moved his work here to the University of California campus of veterinary science.

The trouble with studying the liver under normal circumstances, is this—when the liver is ailing, other organs of the body come to its rescue. By studying a liver independent of such help, Brauer and other scientists hope to pinpoint the real causes of liver malfunctions.

Other devices have been constructed to take the place of bodily functions, notably an artificial kidney, but Brauer's device is believed to be the only one being used in liver study.

A small valved pump serves as a "heart" and the gadget has a "glass lung." The liver itself rests in a cup-shaped bed. A small duct takes away the bile production which is measured and analyzed.

"Lunch here," said Brauer, "is served regularly on the minute," and he pointed to a metering of sugar and other blood foods being conducted through the tubes to the living liver.
