WHO SOLD YOU THAT PHONY ARTHRITIS?

A Virginia correspondent tells me in 2,000 words that I'm a little mixed up about Aunt Polly and Uncle Pete saying they have found medicine that conquers arthritis. It is John Doe, M. D. and Robert Roe, M. D., who tell the world that first this wonder drug and later that one (cortisone, ACTH, etc.) will do the trick.

(What I said was that the trick specialists and "clinic" racketeers tell Aunt Polly and Uncle Pete that the new remedy gives great "promise" — and Polly and Pete see that the story gets on the front page.) The Virginia correspondent then consoles me by saying "I am 100 per cent with you when you say diet has considerable to do with arthritis."

Not with me, Mister, I have never said anything of the sort. Evidently you have confused some other's stuff with mine. The only cause of arthritis, so far as I can learn, is infection, and a doctor who diagnoses arthritis and prescribes or administers treatment as though the trouble were a specific disease amenable to a specific remedy is just stringing the patient along. If the doctor believes there is chronic inflammation of joint tissues (arthritis), the least he can do is try to determine what causes the inflammation — whether it is streptococcus, staphylococcus, tubercle bacillus, Treponema pallidum, gonococcus, Brucella, pneumococcus.

The Virginia correspondent, having gone through the best advertised "clinic," lost his teeth and his tonsils, feels qualified to instruct an ordinary doctor in pathology and therapeutics. Like many other Yankee Wiseacres who condescend to read this column occasionally, this one is so eager to teach me the facts of life that he can't quite grasp the distinction I make between the real arthritis and the rheumatism. Real arthritis is joint inflammation, as already explained. It accounts for not more than

5 per cent (one in 20) of the cases of chronic joint disability. Perhaps 10 or 15 per cent of the cases of joint disability of long duration are traumatic — the consequence of strain or injury; and in many of these traumatic joint disabilities, orthopedic surgery will restore nearly if not quite normal functions.

In the great majority of cases of joint disability of long duration (over a year) there is no inflammation at all, no ititis, of any kind, but just physical degeneration of the joint tissues, and this is what I (propose to) call rheumatiz — RHEUMATIZ, that is, not "rheumatism."

Rheumatiz is physical degeneration of joint tissues. The joint or joints with this disability are neither inflamed nor infected.

Physical degeneration is due to nutritional deficiency through the years.

Excessive Sweating

Answer—Most convenient to carry some aluminum chloride powder in tightly stoppered bottle (it absorbs moisture if not kept in airtight container) and dissolve half an ounce level tablespoonsful of it in three fluidounces (16 tablespoonsful) of distilled water (such as that used for filling batteries) or rain or snow water. Mix or sponge the solution on the skin and allow it to dry before dressing. One such application daily for two or three days will control the trouble for a week or more.
Have had diabetes for at least three years. Why am I always hungry? Two diabetic friends of the same age (44) control by diet alone. They say hunger doesn't bother them much, but they both take vitamin B 30 mg. tablets daily. They also say this helps their nerves. Should I take 'em too? (D.M.)

Ships Head for Arctic With DEW Line Troops

Halifax, N. S.—(U.P.)—Two United States warships headed today up the coast of Labrador to a secrecy-shrouded destination in the Canadian Arctic.

The attack cargo ship Thuban and the landing ship 880 left Halifax during the week end after taking on supplies and equipment for the distant early warning (DEW) radar line in the far north. They also carried troops who will guard the DEW line.

The ships are part of a great armada of 117 United States Navy ships which will move into Arctic waters this summer to take supplies, equipment and men into the DEW line now under construction. Many of the ships will be guided to their destinations by the Halifax-based Canadian Arctic patrol vessel Labrador.

Flash Flood Blocks California Highways

Bishop, Calif. — (U.P.) — U.S. Highway 395 and State Route 120 below Tioga Pass were blocked off Saturday as a torrent of debris-filled water poured into Mono lake for the second time in 24 hours.

Mono county deputies reported a second cloudburst drenched the mountains Friday night and within an hour a flash flood belted across the two highways blocking them with mud and boulders.

Five camps parked in a Lake-side tourist camp were reported swept into the lake.

Deputies said more than 300 persons in the vacation area were without fresh water because the freak summer storms polluted the water supply with mud. Trucks were hauling in water, they said.

Eight unoccupied cabins and a gas station at Tioga lodge on the shore of Mono lake were washed out Thursday by the first cloudburst when a wall of water belted down the mountains.

At one point near Puerto Rico the Atlantic ocean is 44,000 feet deep.
