The large tonsils of children are usually just enlarged, not infected. In most instances they shrink to normal size in the summer if the children play outdoors as much as they should. Therefore when the ever-ready operator urges immediate removal of the child's "bad tonsils" in the winter or spring, give the child a break—wait and see what the good old summertime will do for those "bad tonsils."

Neuberger Urges PPL Permit Approval

Washington—(U.P.)—Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) said today he has urged the Federal Power Commission to approve an application of the Pacific Power and Light Company for a 74,000 kilowatt power installation on the Lewis river in Washington.

Neuberger said he favors government development of main-stream multipurpose sites in the region. But, he added, private companies should "play a vital role" in meeting power demands by developing sites on smaller streams.
