Labor Delegates Hold Committee Sessions To Scan Resolutions

The 53rd convention of the Oregon State Federation of Labor broke into eight committees yesterday afternoon to consider the 63 resolutions introduced since Monday.

Federation union label director and others of that department held a short meeting in the Medford Labor Temple in the evening.

Measures considered by the committees covered a wide range of interests. Resolution No. 3, requesting the governor to replace the present chairman of the Unemployment Compen-

In the Tuesday afternoon session, a resolution (No. 59) was introduced supporting a sliding scale for those delegates with receding hairlines.

"The scale shall be: full moon, 25 cents; three-quarter moon, 50 cents; half moon, 75 cents; quarter moon, one dollar; and no moon, regular price," the resolution read.

It was referred to the grievance committee.

A resolution was introduced to put the federation on record as favoring an elective Public Utility Commissioner, and another supported collective bargaining rights for all public employees.

Elmer McIntire, executive secretary of the Idaho State Federation of Labor, reported that Idaho labor organizations were quite successful in the last state legislature. He said a long desired minimum wage law was passed.

The department vice-commander of the Oregon Veterans of Foreign Wars, Albert H. Birch, declared that the VFW and AFL have "much in common." He said they both work for the same basic principle, to help their fellow man.

A plea for help in the Firefighters International Union's muscular dystrophy campaign was given by Vice-President S. P. Stevens. He also told the convention his union intended to fight for arbitration and conciliation rights for city firemen.

Others delivering brief messages to the delegates were A. C. Logan, director of the state apprenticeship council; Walter E. Griffin, director of apprenticeship, U.S. department of labor; Bill Riggs, international representative of the Pulp and Sulphite Workers International union; and Gertrude Sweet, vice-president of the Culinary Workers International union.

Monday evening nearly 300 attended a no host banquet in the St. Mary's school gym. Later, John Lusk's band and barber-shop quartets from the SPEBSQSA played and sang for a dance.
