Without missing a day on the job he can visit other days and other places and enjoy vicarious thrills and adventures.

In Matto Grosso
Edward Weyer Jr. takes the reader into the wilderness of Brazil's unexplored Matto Grosso and acquaints him with a region and a people never before visited by white men as he searches for Boas, the fabulous ruler of a great hidden area. Here are tribes still living as their Stone Age ancestors did.

In "Tales of the African Frontier" J. A. Hunter and Daniel P. Mannix have combined to chronicle the adventure of the remarkable men who opened wildest Africa. In its accounts of slave trading, tribal wars, the exploits of hunters, the work of missionaries, the rush to build empires, and the weird rise of the Mau Mau, this history surpasses in romance and excitement that of any other frontier of civilization.

Alaskan Trail-Blazers
Nevertheless, there are thrills in the story of Alaska's trail-blazers of a generation ago, the explorers, the prospectors, the trappers and fishermen, all the sturdy pioneers who pushed their way into the unknown reaches of Alaska and opened the territory to permanent settlement. 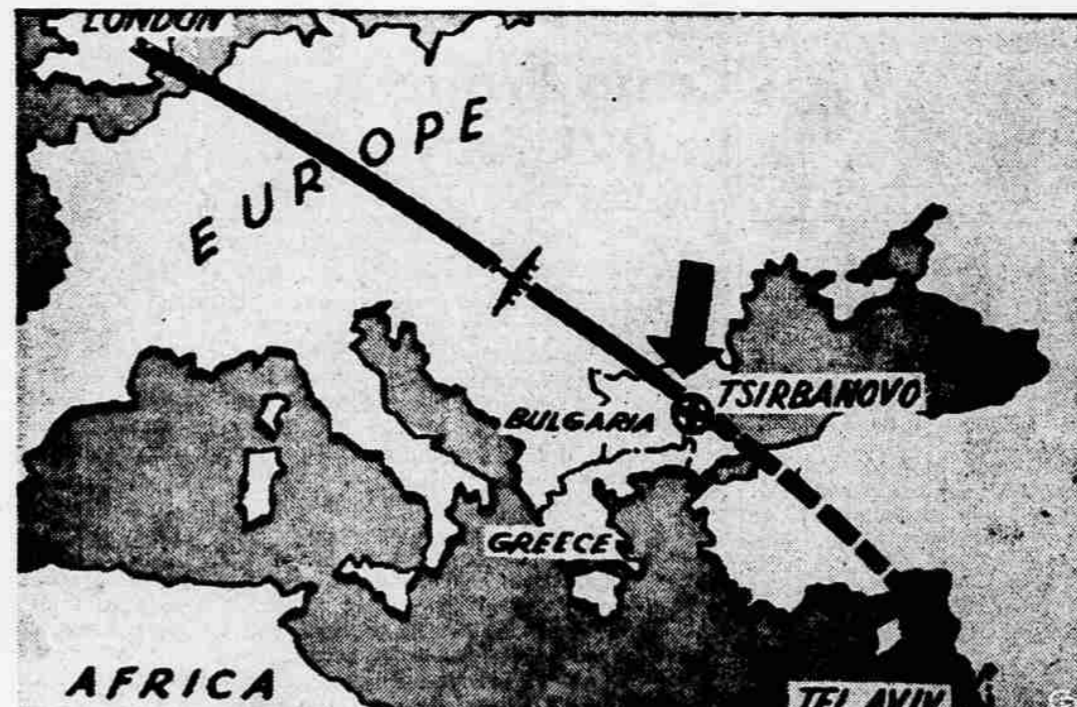

The northwest frontiers are explored in a brand new edition of the pioneer classic, "Canoe and Saddle", by Theodore Winthrop, which makes lively reading of authentic history.
In addition to these true adventure accounts, the library has recently acquired several new novels of particular interest to masculine readers.
