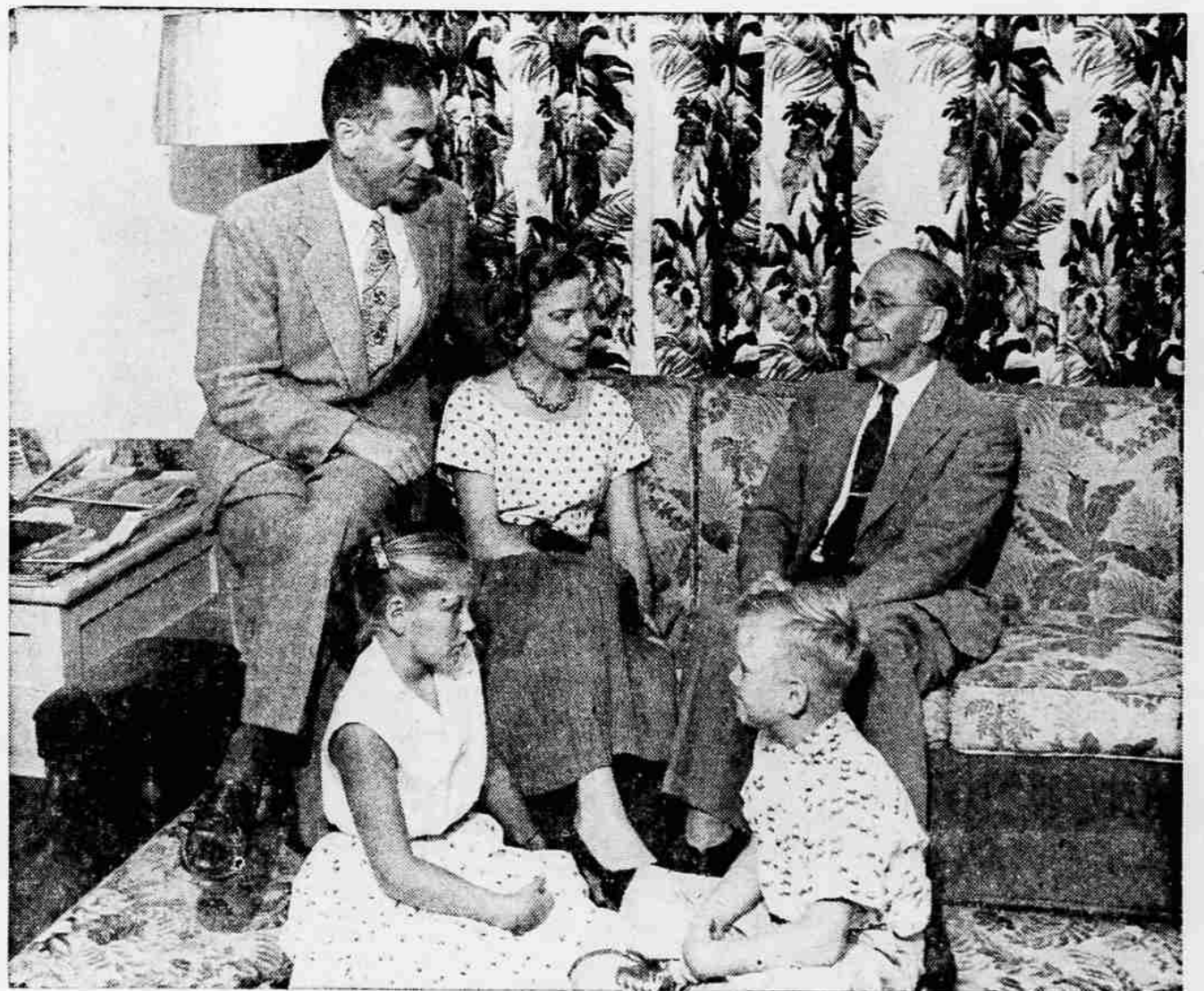

Visitors in the News



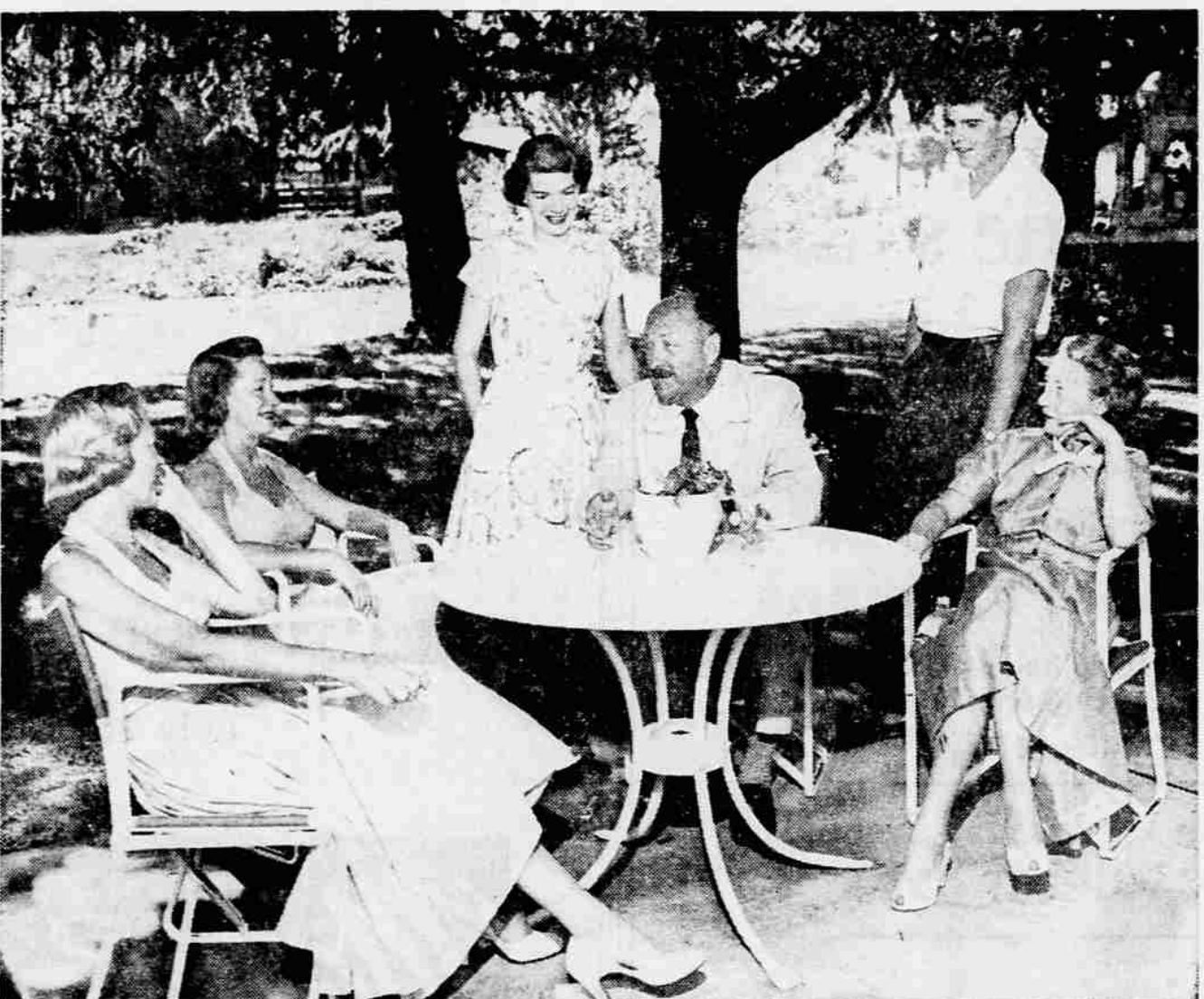
