

Lewis Watched For Wage Demands

Washington — (U.P.) — Coal industry officials watched John L. Lewis uneasily today for news of new wage contract demands for his United Mine Workers.

Lewis has not gone after any new demands since 1952, when he won a \$1.00 a day increase that brought his soft coal miners' wages to \$18.25 a day.

He is free to serve new contract demands along with a 60-day strike notice at any time, and has been since Aug. 1, 1953. But coal industry officials think that time would be a "logical" time. A 60-day strike notice served today would run out on the third anniversary of the signing of the 1952 contract and a strike in the autumn "coal rush" season would be tough on the industry.

Lewis, however, could try his 1951 strategy. This was to negotiate secretly an agreement with Harry Moses, head of the Bituminous Coal Operators' association, largest of the bargaining groups, without serving any notice.

Coal industry and union officials claim Lewis has given no indications yet that he intends to go after new wage contract demands this year.

12,500 John Deere Workers Go on Strike

Moline, Ill. — (U.P.) — About 12,500 members of the CIO United Auto Workers went on strike against eight John Deere & Co. plants in Iowa and Illinois today, but union and company negotiators still tried to reach an agreement.

The strike went into effect at midnight as marathon negotiation sessions continued.

The company and union officials met off and on from 1 p.m. yesterday until 4 a.m. today. At that time a recess was declared so the negotiators could get some sleep. But they were due to meet again at 1 p.m.

The union is seeking a guaranteed annual wage plan and is fighting a company proposal to convert its Des Moines and Dubuque plants from piece rate to uniform hourly wage rates.

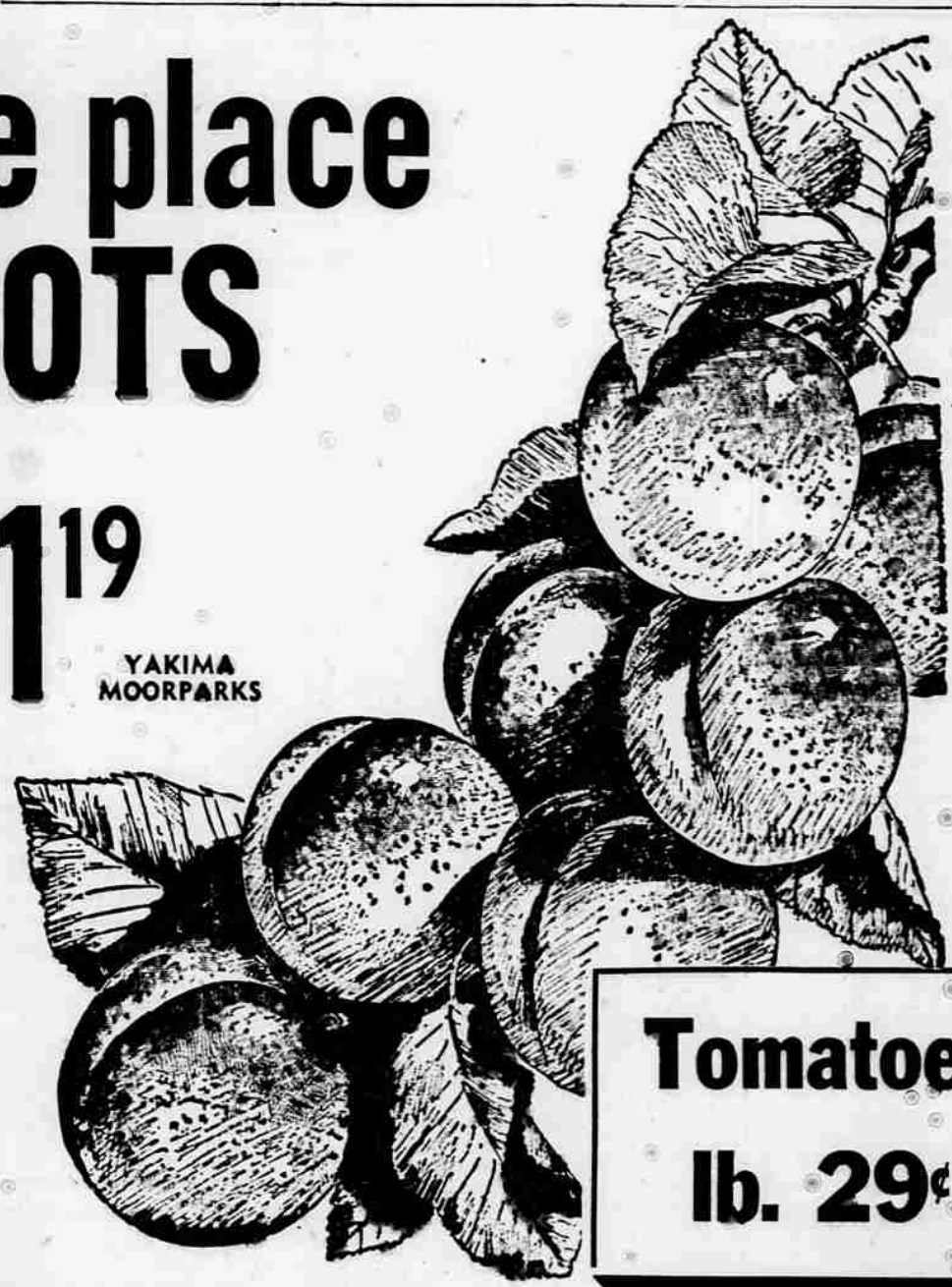
