Crowd of More Than 25,000 Predicted for Rams-Steelers Tilt in Multnomah Stadium

Portland — Professional football takes command of the local sports scene this week when the Los Angeles Rams meet the Pittsburgh Steelers at Multnomah Stadium Saturday night. The kickoff will be at 8:30 p.m.

This game will mark the coaching debut of Sid Gillman of the Rams as he opposes Walter Kiesling of the Steelers, starting his second year as their coach.

Oregon Sports Attractions expects a crowd of more than 25,000 for the first game of the year. The game will be televised to California but will be blacked out in Oregon.

Norm Van Brocklin, who performed seasonally in leading the Rams to victories over the New York Giants and Chicago Cardinals in Portland last year, will again be at the quarterback helm for the Rams.

Although the advance ticket sale has come up to expectations, Oregon Sports Attractions reports that good reserved seats are still available at the box office here at J. K. Gill's. Five thousand general admission tickets will go on sale at the stadium the day of the game.

Solon Raps Nixon For Umbrella Attitude

Washington — (U.P.) — Rep. Arthur Klein of New York "on behalf of the umbrella industry of New York" has taken Vice President Richard Nixon to task for his attitude toward umbrellas.

Nixon banned umbrellas at National Airport when President Eisenhower returned, in the rain, from his Geneva conference. He said the umbrella had become "the symbol of appeasement."

Klein said in a floor speech yesterday that Nixon's comment was "unfortunate." There are 3,000 people employed in the umbrella industry in New York.

Klein said, and it has been tough enough on them this year, what with no rain at all, without Nixon making it still tougher.

The New York Democrat assured the House that the umbrella is simply an indication that the carrier wants to keep dry during a rainstorm.

Crooked River Project Offered by Rep. Coon

Prineville — (U.P.) — Rep. San Coon of Oregon has notified authorities in Prineville he has introduced a bill authorizing construction of the Crooked River reclamation project in Crook county.

The project would include Prineville dam on the Crooked river about 20 miles north of Prineville. Coon said a small diversion dam, canals and pump-out plants would also be provided for in the \$6,399,000 bill.

Coon said the department of interior and the bureau of the budget will prepare reports on the proposal during recess so that hearings can be held as soon as congress reconvenes.

The proposed dam was described by Coon as rising 170 feet above the river bed. It would provide 153,000 acre feet of reservoir capacity.
