

Psychoanalyst Sets Forth Three Types Who Enjoy Defeat and Pain

New York—(U.P.)—A medical psychoanalyst who also is a noted theoretician in Freudian psychology has set forth the three principle types of people who "unconsciously look for and enjoy defeat, humiliation, rejection, and pain."

First is "the injustice-collecting type," said Dr. Edmund Bergler.

"This is a person who at all times is potentially or actually enraged because he is the victim of some terrible wrong," Bergler continued. "He will provoke an actual—or if necessary, a potential enemy—until he succeeds in getting his badly needed dose of injustice."

Accepts Substitute

"Between doses, he will accept as substitute a diet of impersonal, universal injustice. Since the world is what it is, the injustice collector is in no danger of remaining unsatisfied. This type is characterized by an air of hyper-excitement, hyper-toughness, and hyper-belligerency."

Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — English actor Michael Wilding admitted today he's "stunned" by the old practice — the gossip mills whispering about his marriage.

As is usual in the film colony, columnists have been speculating whether the marriage of the suave actor to one of Hollywood's most beautiful women, Elizabeth Taylor, is on solid ground. Items have filtered from luscious Liz' set of "Giant" at Warner Studio that all is not well with the Wildings' love nest.

But the tall, sophisticated Wilding insisted "the marriage is fine, thank you, just fine."

"If you have a good marriage you ignore the gossip columns and just enjoy the marriage, make the most of it," he said in his clipped, fast-talking British way. "We've been married three years now, and they still say if our marriage catches on—"

Tired of Gossip

Wilding sat in the living room of the couple's hilltop home in Benedict Canyon. The house, of extreme modern design, features wall of stone and another of a long living room with one glass. The actor presided over by three cats, three dogs, a cook and assorted secretaries. He was surprisingly informal and friendly — so informal, in fact, he prefers to walk over his coffee table and couch instead of around them.

"These fan magazines," he went on. "I see titles on the covers like, 'Will Liz' Bay Save the Marriage?' or, 'Will Liz Lose Her Looks?' I have to buy the magazines so I can read them and find out."

"Actually, I find those gossip stories immensely dull. They write about the same people — going to get a divorce, going to get married, or going to stay that way. I am tired of reading about Tony getting out of bed and Janet dressing him."

When he and Liz traveled to Europe two years ago, Wilding said, he read that "friends said the Wildings were having a bad time." One picture showed her arriving alone in one city.

Our friends never said that — and I was on the plane with Liz but they cut me out of the picture," he laughed.

Marriage Comes First

"Liz gets upset over these things but I get quite a kick out of it. One columnist said Liz was a bore and couldn't grow up. Nothing could be farther from the truth. It's a bit of a rum, y'know, to say that kind of thing, or to say she's behaving badly on the set of 'Giant.' She's fine."

Wilding also regarded with detached amusement the cry of "May-December." He is 44, Liz 23.

"I'm mentally retarded so we come to the same age," he grinned.

Wilding was signed by MGM after he and the MGM star were wed. Recently, after three pictures, he left the studio "because they had no good roles for me."

"I would like to do some light comedies," he said. Noel Coward also wants me to do a play in London but I don't think it's good for a marriage to be apart.

"And my marriage comes first," he said. "Acting comes second."

And then there is "the coldly detached type."

"Phenomenologically, he seems to represent the opposite of the injustice collector. He is an icicle personified—distant, cold, unmoved, frequently so taciturn that he is classed with the 'he gives me the creeps' variety," Bergler said.

"His presence makes other people uncomfortable. His pose is that of a visitor from another planet. He pays no compliments, and is never guilty of making a moderately friendly - laudatory remark. Inwardly, of course, he is the same erupting volcano as his brother under the skin, the clearly visible injustice collector."

Also there is the "nice" type. Painful Situation

"They are interested in your troubles, and eager to be helpful. Under this ingratiating surface is a hopelessly entangled masochist, suffering for reasons which he cannot understand, which is his construction of the unhappy situation. In general this type accepts his conscious unhappiness with stoicism and resignation. It is hopeless to try to help these people with common-sense advice. Their inextinguishable stock of rationalizations assures the permanence of their painful situation."

These people, who are classified as "psychic masochists," are different from other people only because they obtain a great unconscious enjoyment from suffering than most people, Bergler said in the technical publication, "Diseases of the Nervous System."

Full-fledged psychic masochists "violate the basic tenet of conscious existence—self interest." It is so contradictory, he said, that "the average person circumvents the difficulty by denying that such people exist in the first place."

But they do exist, and to enable anyone to see that they do, he set forth the three principal types.
