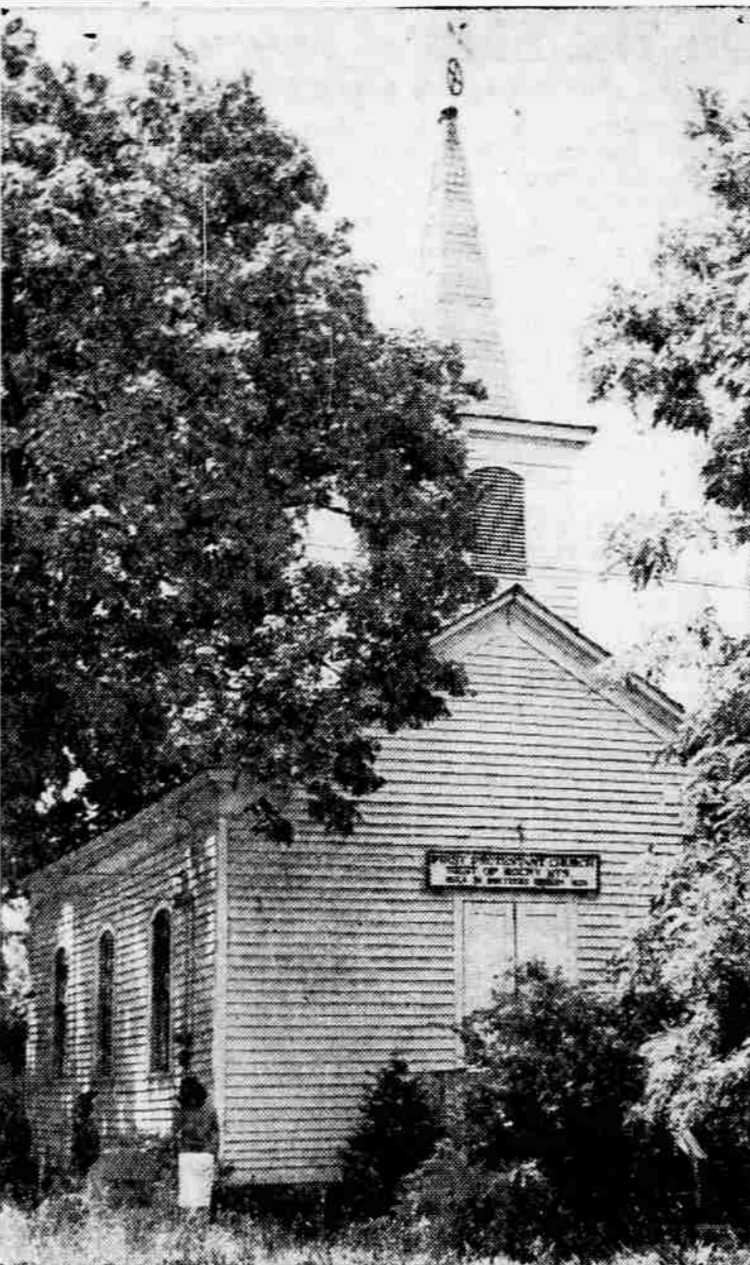

HISTORIC METHODIST CHURCH—The old Methodist church in Jacksonville will be opened Sunday for services at 7:30 p.m., which will be conducted by the Rev. J. M. Harrell, retired Methodist minister. The services will be held in connection with the Jacksonville Jubilee. The church was dedicated Jan. 1, 1854, and is claimed to be the oldest Protestant church west of the Rocky mountains still in good repair and use. The church is located on Fifth st., Jacksonville, and is situated diagonally from the Jacksonville Museum. The public is invited.
