Browns Finish Training For All-Star Game

Sandusky, a 250-pounder, will become the team's "swing" tackle with young Mike McCormack, a faster 250-pounder and last year's middle guard, taking over as the right offensive guard. Sandusky will be spotted on either offense or defense, Brown said.

Moore Says Rocky Lost 'His Punch'

North Adams, Mass. — (U.P.)—Challenger Archie Moore quietly defied the kayo lightning to strike him today as he observed that "Rocky Marciano has lost his punch."

Champion Marciano, meanwhile was hard at work at his training camp in Grossinger, N.Y., trying to sweat off the extra poundage he picked up during a week end off from training to attend his sister's wedding.

"I think Marciano has lost his punch," said Moore at his camp here. "In his last fight he hit Don Cockerell with everything but the ring posts and Cockerell finally collapsed rather than being knocked out. Jimmy Slade knocked out Cockerell in four rounds and it took Marciano eight rounds to do it."

Moore sparred one round each Tuesday with Johnny Jenkins, Clint Bacon and Joe Baski, the 260-pound former heavyweight contender.

Marciano isn't anything close to 260 pounds, but he did tip the scales at an even 200 Tuesday, when he returned from his "week end off." Manager Al Weill said he expects the champion to weigh about 187 for the title fight at Yankee stadium, Sept. 20.
