Williams Shrugs Off 2,000th Hit

New York — (U.P.) — Ted Williams, instead of celebrating the 2,000th hit of his major league career, shrugged it off instead today and said he was "sorry it had to be such a lousy one."

The hit that enabled Williams to reach the milestone was a bloop single that dropped in centerfield during the first inning of Thursday's game between the Red Sox and Yankees. It was hit off Bob Turley.

"I was inkoogilGeos," bopped "I was looking forward to getting it but I was hoping that number 2,000 would be a lot better one than that," added the curly-haired 36-year old Boston slugger.

"The double I got off the fifth inning was a lot more like it," he said. "I hit that ball a lot better."

Williams' 2001st hit was a solid smash that bounced into the right field stands for a ground-rule double but the hit before that put him in a class with Stan Musial of the Cardinals, Enos Slaughter of the Athletics and Mickey Vernon of the Senators as the only men active in the majors who have made 2,000 or more hits. Only 96 players, including Williams, have collected that many hits in major league history.

Portland Signs For Multnomah

Portland — (U.P.) — Multnomah stadium will be the home of the Portland Beavers for the next 20 years under terms of a document signed Friday by Portland Baseball Club, Inc., Multnomah Civic Stadium association and Multnomah Athletic Club officials.

Signings climaxed months of negotiations. Under terms of the lease, the ball club will pay the stadium group \$35,000 a year rental or ten per cent of the gross receipts.

Renovations of the stadium to accommodate baseball will be completed in time for the 1956 season. The new agreement is to take effect Jan. 1, 1956.

Clay Brown, president of the ball club, said he thought the switch from the ancient Vaughn street ball park to the stadium was a "great move" for the Beavers.

The 30,000 seats in the stadium will give the Beavers one of the best parks in the PCL, Brown said.

The old Vaughn street location was sold to the California Bag and Metal company recently as development as an industrial site.

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Moore Works on Secret Punches

North Adams, Mass. — (U.P.) — Cheerful Norman, trainer of heavyweight challenger Archie Moore, said today that Moore's surprise secret workout on his "day off" Thursday was a "schooling session."

"Archie wanted to try out certain punches and a number of defensive moves, which he didn't want anyone to see," said Norman. "We plan to do this about once a week."

The winter season will start Aug. 22 at the Bowling lanes.

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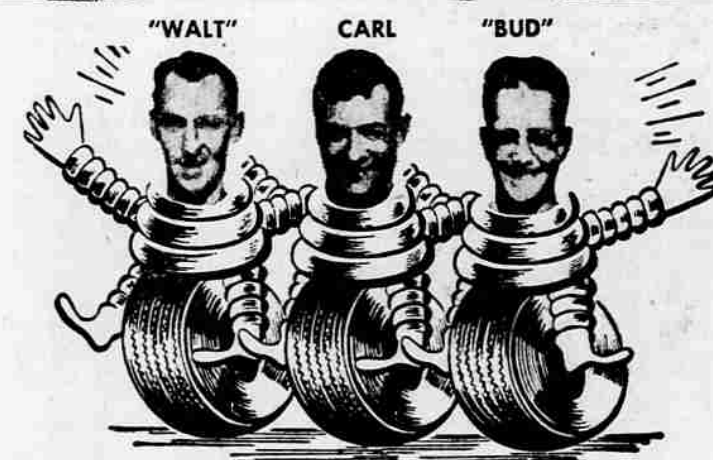
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
