

Tighter Stock Regulations Seen

Portland — (U.P.)—Tighter regulations for uranium stocks and other cheap "penny issues" are being planned by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Board Chairman Harold E. Wood, St. Paul, Minn., said today.

The restrictions would be designed to reduce the possibility of fraud, Wood said. Uranium stocks and Canadian oil and mining stocks are the "biggest present headache," he said.

The investment broker declared many uranium issues raised just enough money to afford handsome profits to the promoter, his geologists and unscrupulous lawyers and securities dealers.

Nothing has been left over in many instances, Wood said, to finance any actual mining operations. Innocent stock buyers in such cases are left with worthless certificates.

The association is holding confidential hearings in Denver on complaints against "a large number" of uranium stock dealers, Wood said. Members found guilty of malpractice would be suspended or expelled from the association.



Congress 'Good,' Edith Green Says

Portland — (U.P.)—Rep. Edith Green (D-Ore.) today described the first session of Congress as "a good Congress" which did much to promote the welfare of the individual.

The freshman Oregon Democrat returned to Portland yesterday. She will maintain an office here until mid-September, when she is scheduled to visit Alaska with associates on the committee on interior and insular affairs.

Mrs. Green said the recently-ended session of Congress "did much in the field of the individual." She cited the improved social security legislation, minimum wage law, postal workers pay increases and pay increases for classified civil service employees.

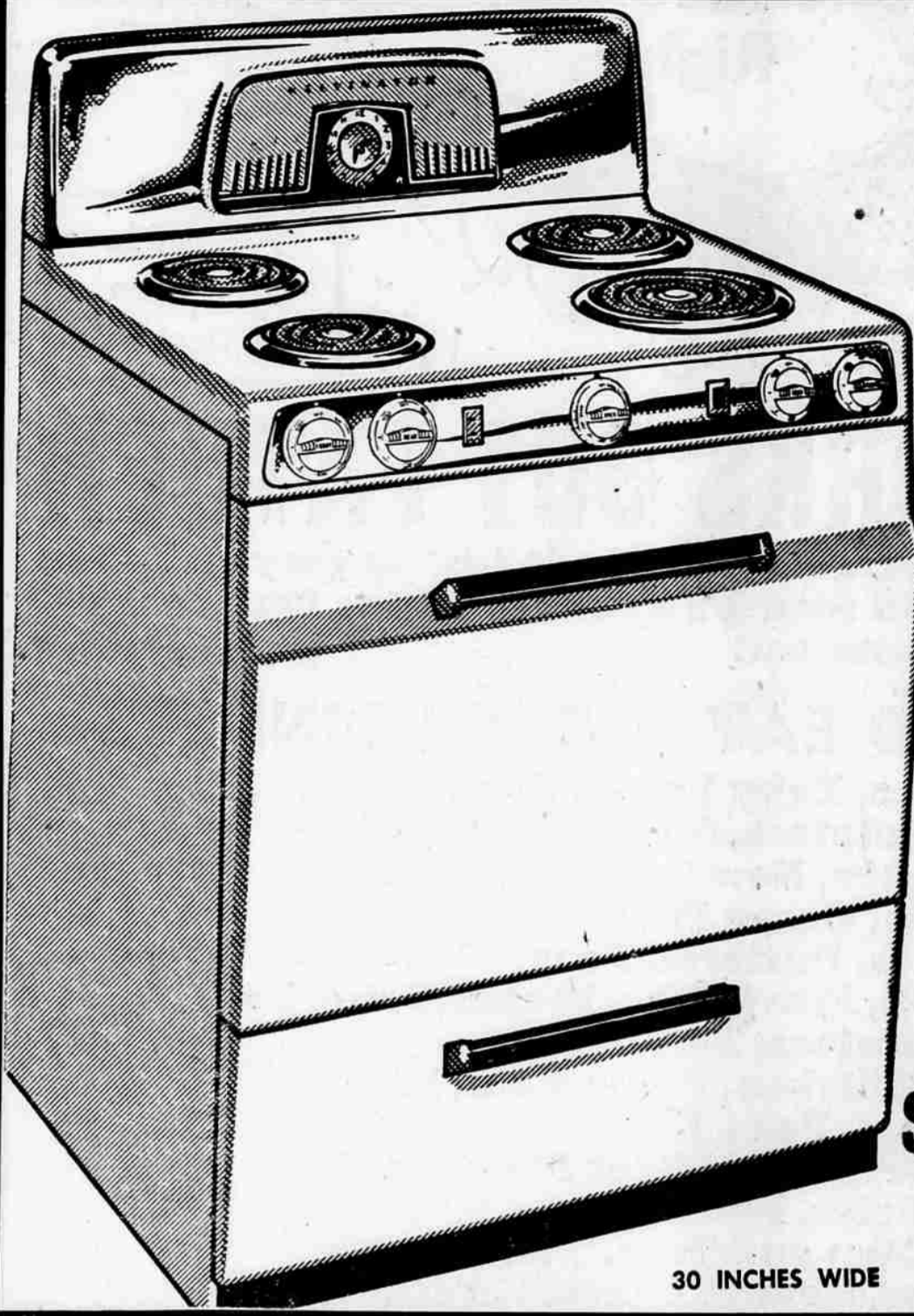

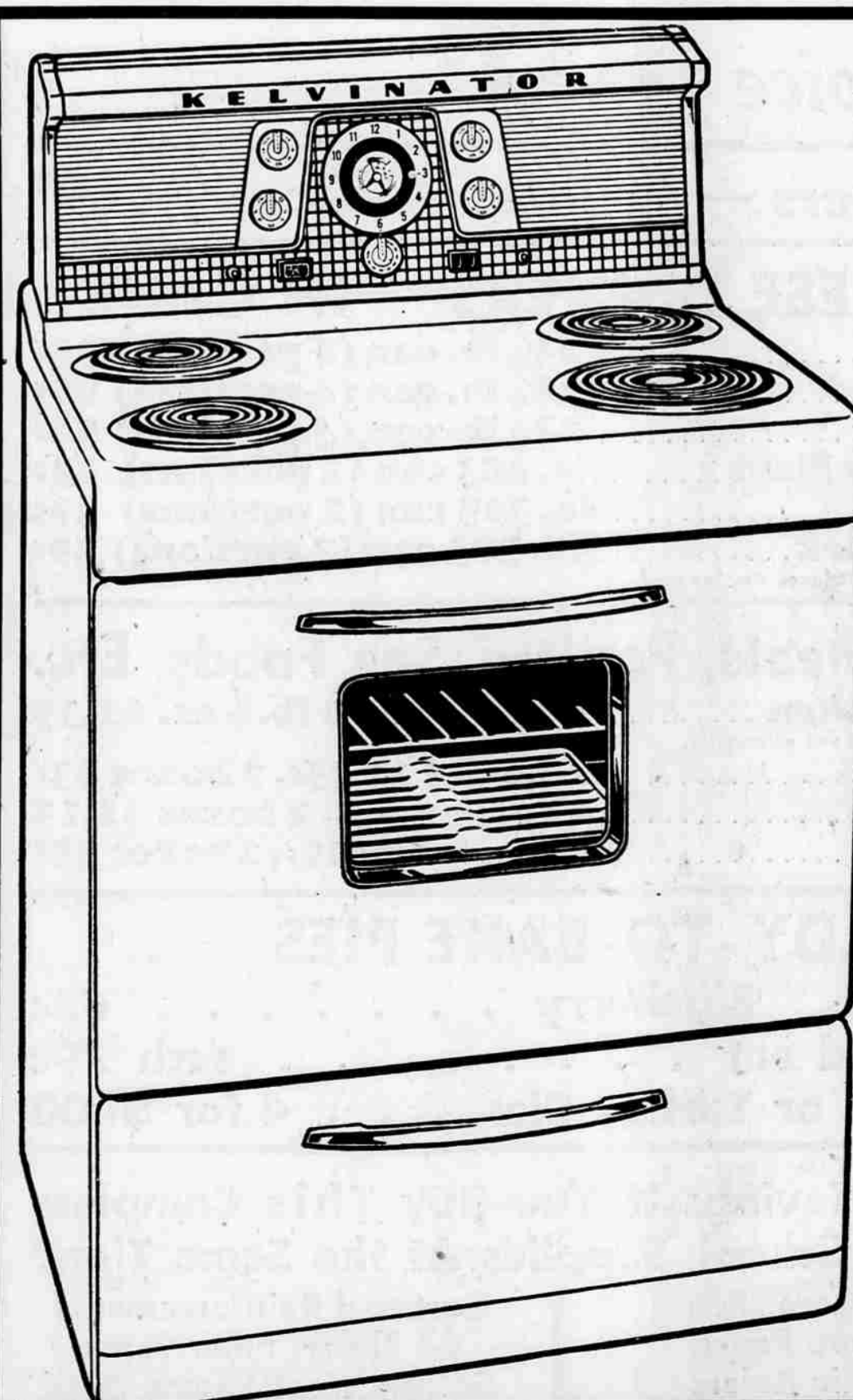
