NO MEDICINE REQUIRED

Some day, somewhere, someone may be cured of joint disability by a wonder drug, but up to this moment no such cure has occurred, to the best of my knowledge, although hundreds of victims, under the influence of "miracle medicine" have been so impressed by the extraordinary relief the medicine gives for a few days that they have joyfully proclaimed a cure—only to realize a week later that the old joint trouble is as bad as it was before the experiment was started.

The great advantage that what I call "arthritis" is over what you call "rheumatism" is that no medicine is required to prevent or cure rheumatism; whereas, if you accept as genuine the phony diagnosis of "arthritis," you're in for the widest assortment of medicines, old, new and "miracle," the medical merchant can persuade you to take, preferably stuff that can be administered in "shots," eh, children?

When I say no medicine is required to prevent or cure rheumatism, I'm flattering most of you, I'm afraid, for in order to prevent or cure the rheumatism, it is necessary to know how to select a diet that provides the essentials of good nutrition and to follow the diet, not for a week or a month but for as long as you wish to remain free from the manifestations of nutritional deficiency (malnutrition) that constitute rheumatism.

This takes more than a modicum of intelligence. It takes more than ordinary personality and character. I could say much about it if space were available. Tell you what—send me ten cents (clean, please) and stamped self-addressed envelope and ask for these two pamphlets (ask in writing, please): "Wheat to Eat and Calcium and Rheumatism."

In a few words here's what I'm trying to tell you:

In most instances of joint disability of gradual development and long (over a year) duration there is little or no inflammation (arthritis) at all. The pathological condition is degeneration of joint tissues, and in the absence of a common or familiar name for degeneration of joint tissues,

Educators Worried Over Lack of Space

Omaha, Neb. — (U.P.)—Many college educators worried about getting space for expected heavy classes in the next few years should take lessons in how to utilize the space they have, a California educator says.

Donavon Smith said there are very few colleges in the country that could not stretch their present facilities to accommodate more students.

"If classrooms were used at a full capacity schedule, they would be filled eight hours a day for all week days," he said.

He predicted that most building by colleges in the years ahead will emphasize expansion of non-classroom facilities.

Smith is working on a survey of nine of the Big Ten universities, part of which concerns space utilization.

\$2,671 Collected for Flood Relief Fund

A total of \$2,671.93 was collected by the Jackson county chapter of the National American Red Cross northeast flood fund campaign, Red Cross officials announced today.

The goal for Jackson county was \$1,603. The largest share of the funds came from Tag Day efforts last Wednesday, when the Medford United Crusade authorized the one-day campaign for the drive.

Red Cross officials expressed appreciation for contributions to flood victims in the northeast. They said \$2,200 of the total has been sent, and the remainder will be sent today.
