

Marciano, Moore Break Camp, Await Tuesday Title Scuffle

New York — (U.P.) — Rocky Marciano and Archie Moore broke camp today and headed for New York, where more than 100 workmen at Yankee stadium were arranging seats and erecting the ring for Tuesday night's heavyweight championship fight.

Unbeaten Marciano was still a 16-5 favorite in the betting to keep his title. But he was a much heavier favorite among sports writers. A poll of 34 disclosed today that only one picked Moore. The other 33 forecast a kayo victory by Rocky.

Don Wolfe, sports editor of the Toledo, Ohio Blade, not only selected 38-year-old Moore to win, but he said it would be on a third-round knockout. He stressed "Archie is a far superior fighter and he will shoot the works."

Both Confident
Champion and challenger expressed confidence as they finished training Sunday in their mountain camps — Rocky in the Catskills and Archie in the Berkshires. Each sparred two rounds in his final workout.

Archie sharpened his long left jab and left hook in one round with Gorilla Brown and one with Johnny Jenkins. His total of 108 rounds since he arrived at North Adams, Mass., on Aug. 1 was the most for any fight in his 19-year career. He expects to scale 186 pounds Tuesday night at the weigh-in in Madison Square garden. That would be only one pound less than Rocky's expected figure.

Rocky's two rounds with Sgt. J. B. Reed of the Air Force at Grossinger, N.Y. Sunday brought his total to 116 since he entered camp on July 29. It was his lowest round-total for any defense. He and his handlers feared over-training that had left him somewhat lethargic for his conquest of Don Cockell at San Francisco, May 16.

Ted Kroll Links Victor

Philadelphia — (U.P.) — Ted Kroll, veteran golf pro from Bethesda, Md., who finished on the short end of four playoffs in the past three years, had \$4,000 worth of revenge today from his playoff triumph in the Philadelphia Daily News Open Golf tournament.

Kroll sank a 30-foot putt to win the tournament Sunday on the first hole of a sudden death playoff with PGA champion Doug Ford. They had tied in the 72-hole tournament at the Cobbs Creek golf course with one-over par 273 scores.

Four other times — at Detroit, El Paso, Cincinnati, and Cleveland — Kroll had gone into playoffs. Cary Middlecott beat him at Detroit and Cleveland Lloyd Mangrum at Cincinnati and Chandler Harper at El Paso.

He started the final round four strokes off the pace of Ford and Bud Holscher, the Apple Valley, Calif., youngster who eventually finished in a tie for fifth.

Doug Higgins of Midland, Tex., overcoming a four-over-par fourth hole when he went into a creek and couldn't come out, and Marty Furgol, finishing with a red hog 64, tied for third place at 274. Fifth place money went to Holscher, Tommy Bolt of Chattanooga and Paul O'Leary of Bismarck, N.M., with 177s.

Philadelphia Beats Rams

Denver — (U.P.) — This city gets few looks at major league professional football and Adrian Burk of the Philadelphia Eagles made sure it won't soon forget what it takes to be a top National league quarterback.

Burk hurled four touchdown passes, three of them to end Pete Pihos, as the Eagles beat the Los Angeles Rams 35-21 Saturday night in an exhibition game before a crowd of 17,000. It was the sixth straight exhibition win without a loss for Philadelphia.

The injury riddled Rams, playing without the services of first string quarterback Norm Van Brocklin managed to outgain the Eagles, 385 yards to 364. Except for a double penalty which nullified a pass interception the Rams might have gained a tie in the hard fought game, featured by several fist fights between players.

The Rams open their league season Sunday in San Francisco against the Forty Niners.

Trailing 28-21 in the fourth period, the Rams moved the ball to the Eagles' one-yard line on a pass interception by Will Sherman. But officials detected Larry Morris of Los Angeles and Bill Stribling of Philadelphia fighting, ruled both players at fault and nullified the pass interception play.
