Herpes Comes in Regular and Large Economy Size

In Yell, one of the Shetland Islands, a school teacher with shingles (doctors call it herpes zoster) caused an outbreak of chickenpox in the pupils.

Last March the chain of events appeared to be repeating itself, for cases of chickenpox were occurring in the family of a man with shingles. Later this outbreak extended all over the island.

From epidemiology studies made in the homes of persons who had shingles and of persons who had had chickenpox in the 1945 outbreak, as described by Drs. Peterson and Black, it seemed evident that the virus of shingles (herpes zoster) is identical with or at least closely related to the virus of chickenpox (varicella).
