To many readers who have been kind enough to write me about it, I owe this explanation. I am merely a paid contributor, without any editorial authority. If part or all of my piece is omitted, there's nothing I can do about it. But readers have great authority if they communicate their likes or dislikes to editor or publisher.

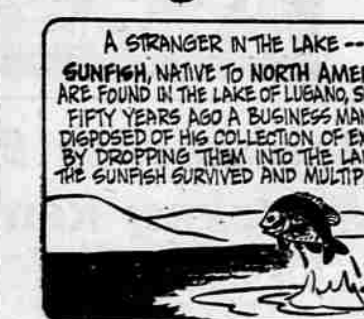
