Honolulu—U.P.—The Dole Hawaiian Pineapple Co. has signed agreements to purchase two Pacific Coast canneries in a move to expand the firm's mainland production facilities.

Dole President Henry A. White announced yesterday the agreements had been signed with F. M. Ball & Co., Oakland, Calif., and Paulus Bros. Packing Co., Salem, Ore.

White said Dole will issue a new 5 per cent \$50 cumulative voting preferred stock in connection with the agreements, which are subject to approval by Dole stockholders. The stockholders will vote on the agreements in November.

"Our eventual aim is this diversification program," White said, "is the creation of a complete line of canned fruits, vegetables and other products of the highest quality, nationally advertised and nationally distributed."
