Bus Driver Given Maximum Penalty

Vancouver, Wash. — (U.P.) — A Portland driver whose car struck and killed an 82-year-old Vancouver pedestrian received the maximum penalty from a Vancouver police court yesterday.

John J. Araway Jr., 48, was sentenced to 90 days in the city jail. He was fined \$300 and had his driver's license suspended for two years.

Araway pleaded guilty to charges of driving while under the influence of liquor and driving without a proper license. His car struck and fatally injured Oscar McCoy last Sunday afternoon.

The fatality occurred just one day before Vancouver could have boasted a full year without a traffic fatality.

Judge Lyle Traux told Araway that reports of the accident were in the hands of the prosecuting attorney and that he might be subject to negligent homicide charges.

Red Clover Seed Production Forecast

Portland — (U.P.) — The U.S. Department of Agriculture today forecast this year's red clover seed production for Oregon at 2,800,000 pounds, up 17 per cent from last year.

A big increase also was reported nationally with the forecast at 87,895,000 pounds, up 58 per cent from a small crop last year. Karl Hobson, Washington State College price specialist, said the big crop was the main reason for the downturn in red clover prices.

Fishermen Help Prove Shad Return To Spawn

Holyoke, Mass. — (U.P.) — Connecticut River fishermen are helping themselves by helping the government.

Already the first finless shad has been turned over to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. And there'll be more, nearly 100,000 more if all goes well.

That's the number of shad removed by the government experts from the Windsor Locks Canal in the fall of 1952. The fishermen are helping the experts prove a theory that the shad come back from the ocean to their fresh water spawning streams after three or four years.

If one of these boys is in a muddle as to how he and the girl friend are going to spend the evening, he says: "Let's get a fix on this evening."

Now for the wonderful world of television ("wonderful" indeed—it's a built-in impossibility for a TV entertainer to say anything extemporaneously while on the air without using the word wonderful.)

The newest word for food is "scoff." Dark eyeglasses are "shadows." The word for taking a break from the job, or whatever, is "split." "Let's split for some scoff."

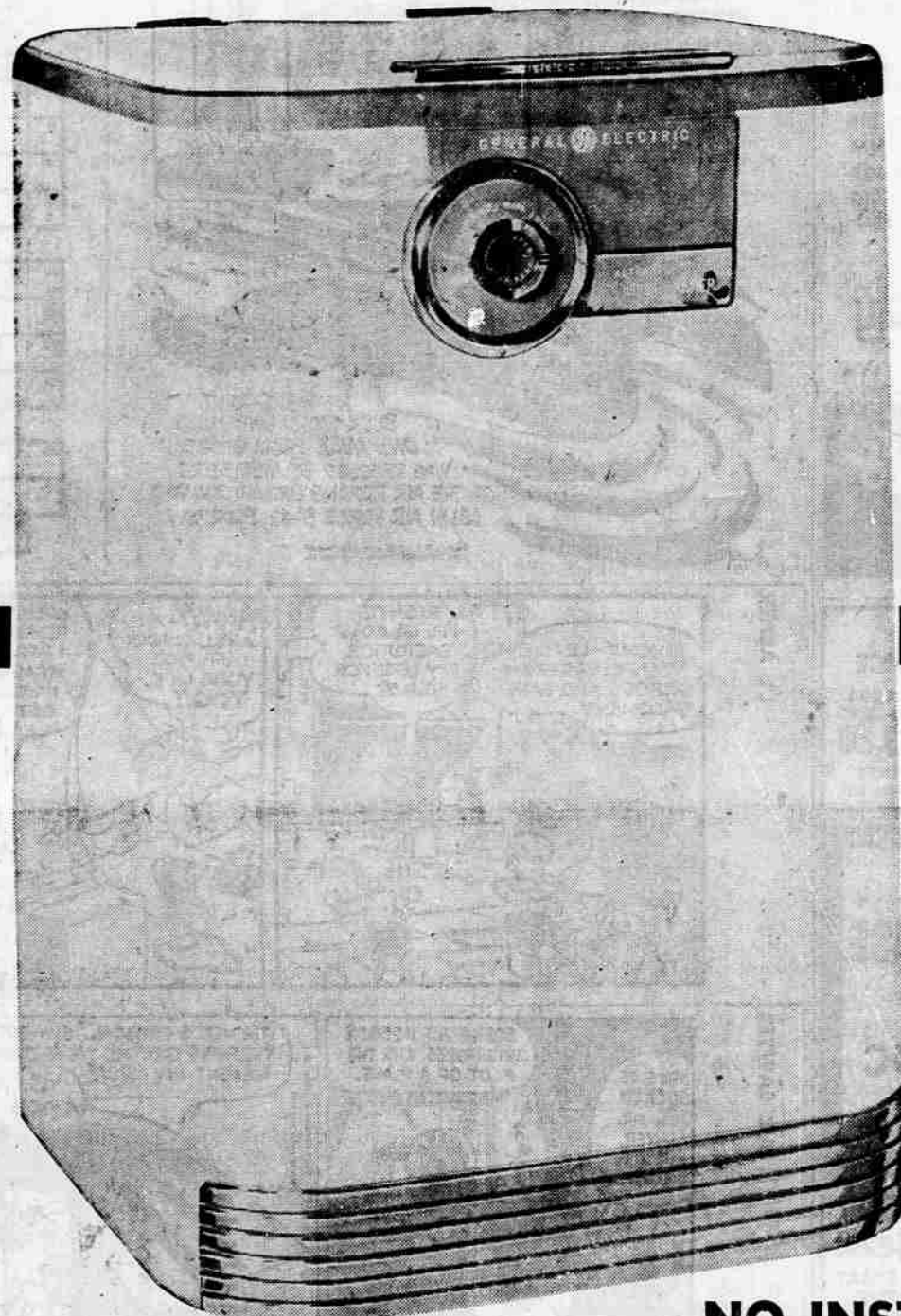
A bed is now a "pad." "I was
