Medford Woman Installed Pythian Sisters Grand Chief

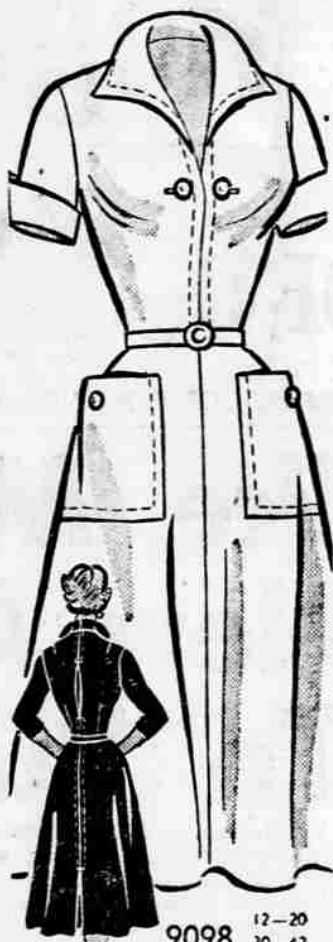

Press As You Sew, Advice of Specialist

Madison, Wis. — (UPI) — Home-sewn garments can have that professional look, if you press as you sew.

Glady Melchoe, clothing specialist at the University of Wisconsin, says the trick is to press each part of the garment before it is joined to another. After making a seam, open it and press flat before going to another seam. Pressed in the same direction as stitched.

Curved areas which fit the rounded parts of the body need to be shaped. That is done by using a pession cushion to get rounded darts and sleeve caps.
