



Back Stairs: Terrace Gives Ike Lift

Denver — (U.P.) — Backstairs at the temporary White House: Few things in President Eisenhower's recovery to date seem to have given him as big a lift as being able to get out in the sun, even for short periods.

The Chief Executive, a hearty active man all his life, loves the outdoors—the fresh air and sunshine.

When the doctors began permitting short sojourns on a sun terrace near his room this week, the President was delighted. Those close to him noticed an immediate brightening of spirits.

The President's doctors couldn't ask for finer climate or scenery than offered in Denver.

The mile-high air is fresh and clear. Nights are getting cool, but the Indian Summer days are golden bright under the warm autumn sun.

The President, lying in the sun in his elevated bed, has a majestic westward view of the Rockies behind Denver. Long's Peak, reaching upward to 14,255 feet, stands clearly although its summit is 57 miles from the hospital.

Mr. Eisenhower hasn't requested many special foods, but whenever he does, his dietitians try to work them into his menu if the doctors approve.

He asked for turnip greens one day and got them.

One of his dietitians is an expert on the subject. She's 2nd Lt. Susie Mae Jones of Uniontown, Ala., a home economics graduate of the famed Tuskegee Institute at Tuskegee, Ala.

Nixon Schedules New York Speeches

Washington — (U.P.) — Vice-President Richard M. Nixon will represent President Eisenhower in a speech before the International Air Transport association in New York next Monday.

Nixon will speak at the New York Herald Tribune Forum the same night.

He also will fulfill a previously scheduled engagement to address the Investment Bankers association of New York Oct. 19.

Nixon cancelled all of his scheduled out of town speeches through Oct. 15 because of Mr. Eisenhower's illness. A spokesman said today Nixon will limit his out of town speeches to places that will permit him to return here the same night.

Wildlife Service Sets Study of Shrimp Grounds

Seattle — (U.P.) — The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service exploratory vessel John N. Cobb will leave here Oct. 17 to study potential shrimp grounds off the Washington coast, a service spokesman said today.

The vessel will cruise for four weeks. A limited amount of deep-water exploratory trawling for bottom fish to record seasonal abundance in certain areas also will be carried out if time and weather permit.

Dr. Hurlock says I was a high school girl. I have suffered from embarrassment and even fear when a boy wanted to kiss me. I still freeze up and try to pull away, although I am now 24 years old. Every time I go on dates I find myself on the defensive, which makes me seem

very cold and unresponsive. I am so afraid my date will want to hold my hand or kiss me that I literally sit on the other side of the car.

"I know this is not the way to behave and it has cost me many dates. I would like to marry and have children, but I know this feeling will stand in my way. Was I born cold and unresponsive or what makes me act this way? And, can it be cured?"

(A) No one is born "cold and unresponsive." People are made that way by some intense emotional experience, usually during their childhood. In girls, where "frigidity" or "coldness" is unusually much stronger than in boys, a terrifying experience with a member of the opposite sex, or a sex education in which

petting is forbidden is usually responsible for frigidity.

Frigidity can be cured, but not easily unless the person knows the cause and then tackles the problem at its root.

You doubtless have no memories of any experience that might have caused you to be frigid. Talk this over with your mother and see if she can remember any such experience. You need professional help. I suggest you consult your doctor,
