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F. Patterson Stops Brad

Los Angeles — (U.P.) — Floyd Patterson, the No. 1 light heavyweight contender from Brooklyn, needed less than three minutes to convince local fight fans that he is the hottest young fighter in the boxing game today.

The 20-year-old Patterson belted out Cal Brad, Los Angeles, in 2:58 of the first round at Olympic Auditorium last night for his eighth straight KO this year. The non-televized bout had been scheduled for six rounds but oddsmakers had

made Patterson a prohibitive choice to win and a 3-1 favorite to do so by a knockout.

Patterson, using left hooks and right crosses, first battered Brad to the canvas midway in the round for an eight count. The relentless onslaught left Brad with a bad cut over his left eye.

Patterson then methodically cut Brad down again with another barrage of blows to the head. A left hook was the finishing punch.

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Sunday Ball Rejected by Vancouver

Oakland, Calif. — (U.P.) — C. L. Brink Laws, president of the Oakland Oaks, has reaffirmed his plans to move his club to Vancouver despite the Canadian city's rejection of a proposal to legalize Sunday baseball.

"The Oaks are going to Vancouver as planned," Laws said yesterday.

"I was a little disappointed to learn that the Vancouver city council had defeated a proposal for the public to vote on whether or not to legalize Sunday baseball," he said. "But that does not make any difference in our plan."

"I have no quarrel with the people of Vancouver, but, I think the council should have at least given them a chance to vote on the problem."

Laws said he will continue to seek relief from the traditional British Columbia attitude against professional sports on Sunday.

4 Times Beaten Hamline Eleven Heads Statistics

New York — (U.P.) — What price statistics?

Hamline university leads the nation's small colleges in forward passing offense today even though it has failed to win a single game in four starts.

Freshman Jerry Foley is the man responsible for lifting Hamline to the top of the passing department, according to figures released by the NCAA service bureau.

Foley has completed 59 aerials in 111 attempts for a total yardage of 727. All told, Hamline has completed 64 of 128 pass attempts for a total yardage of 805 and an average of 201.3 per game.

Total Offense Leader

Foley, the total offense leader among small college players, is credited with 687 yards gained in 121 plays. He is comfortably ahead of runnerup Bill Hamilton of Florence State, with 592 yards in 133 plays, and Dick Zahn of Hiram in third place with 590 yards gained in 61 plays.

To give you an idea how Foley operates, he threw 62 times last Saturday and completed 33 passes for 234 yards in a 33-21 loss to St. John's, Minn. Hamline threw and completed one more pass and completed one team completion record of 34 for one game and tie the all-time one-game team attempt record of 63.

Foley's feverish pitching pace also helped teammate Dick Donlin to rank No. 1 in pass receiving among small college players.

Donlin, a 6 foot 5 inch senior, has caught 27 passes for 290 yards. He set a new all-time college one-game mark by grabbing 18 passes Saturday.

Beavers Acquire St. Paul Hurler

Portland — (U.P.) — The Portland Beavers, already building for 1956, today announced the acquisition of right-handed pitcher Gene Valdez from St. Paul of the American Association in a deal for third baseman Don Eggert.

The Beavers also purchased outfielder Lloyd Merriman from Los Angeles.

Eggert, who hit 22 home runs for Portland last year, was traded for cash to St. Paul for Valdez and two other players. Valdez won 10 and lost 9 with St. Paul last season. The other players are James Koronda, an outfielder, and John Roseboro, a catcher-outfielder.
