BORIC ACID, HUH?

Health authorities in Los Angeles recommended the use of a solution of boric acid in boiled water (distilled water, rain water or snow water preferably, but ordinary tap water if none of these is available) as a soothing eye wash to relieve irritation due to smog, fog, smoke or dust. Oddly enough the conductor of this column cordially believes it or not, approves and applauds this suggestion of the health authorities. No, really, I'm not getting soft or mellow. I'm just delighted to find that some health authorities are not afraid to recommend popular use of a remedy, which the "science writers" of the various newspapers and popular magazines pronounced "dangerous" only a year ago.

Perhaps we shouldn't censure the bright boys and girls who are so designated. In this instance they merely plucked a statement from a report published in a medical journal and built their pieces on it.

What the "science writers" did not inform their readers is that the physicians who reported the "poisoning" of an infant by boric acid applied in the form

of borated talcum powder later retracted their report because they found that the test for boric acid in urine or blood, the test on which they had based their medical journal report is not reliable.

Many "scientific" reports of "boric acid poisoning" by absorption of boric acid through the skin have been based on the same misleading test for boric acid in blood or urine.

Russell Fisher, M. D., Henry Freimuth, Ph. D., Kathleen O'Connor, B.S., and Viola Johns, M. D., state (J A M A, 2/5/55) that boric acid is widely distributed in fruits and other foods. For example a glass of orange juice

contains boron equivalent to one-third of a grain of boric acid. Since everybody gets more or less boron as a natural food constituent a test which shows boric acid in blood or urine has no special significance.

So there's no valid reason why people should not continue to use boric acid solution, boric acid ointment, borated talcum powder and the like in domestic medicine the same as ever. In Little Lesson 14, The Medicine Cupboard, for which send me 25c, free from stickum, please, and stamped, self-addressed envelope, I still tell you how to use the stuff, in the chapter titled Boric Acid Can Do No Harm. How to use it and what for.

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The campaign to frighten people away from the use of boric acid is supported chiefly by contributions of manufacturers of proprietary solutions, powders or salves the manufacturers hope to put in the family medicine cupboard in place of boric acid. And they'll probably succeed in doing so, this being the ever gullible Yankee land.
