

Peacetime Atomic Conference Planned

United Nations, N. Y. — (U.P.) — The United States and Britain are putting finishing touches to a plan for a conference of 84 countries to set up an international atomic agency to supervise peaceful atomic uses, informed sources said yesterday.

The two countries were expected to submit a new resolution calling for such a conference to the U. N. Main Political Committee, probably tomorrow.

Under a resolution previously presented by the American and British, with co-sponsorship from Australia and Belgium, the U. N.'s 60 members and the 24 additional members of its specialized agencies were invited to submit comments to Washington on a draft statute for the atomic agency. The draft statute had been negotiated by the United States and eight other countries which will be charter members of the agency.

Russian Builder Buys Typical American Home

San Bruno, Calif. — (U.P.) — I. K. Kozulla, head of a touring group of Soviet builders, bought a typical furnished American home Monday and he wants it delivered.

The model home, built for display at the Rollingwood tract, will be shipped to Russia pre-cut. Each piece will be marked for assembly by Russian carpenters in Moscow.

Richard Doyle, executive secretary of the Associated Home Builders of San Francisco, hosts to the Russians in the Bay Area said Kozulla expressed great fancy for the home.

Natural Seeding Said Still Major Method For Reforestation

Portland — (U.P.) — The Society of American Foresters was told yesterday that natural seeding or "regeneration" still is the most important method of reforestation of Douglas fir forest lands.

Leo A. Isaac, in charge of silvicultural research of the Pacific Northwest forest and range experiment station here, said natural reforestation saves as much as \$25 per acre and results in better growth and development than in man-planted stands. He stressed need for more information and research into how better seed crops and seeds of better "genetic quality" may be obtained.

He added that "a little planting or seeding may always be necessary to keep forest lands fully protective."

Meeting in Second Day

Foresters were in the second day of their meeting, Richard E. McArdle, chief U. S. forester, gave the main speech Monday in which he said there is enough timber to avoid a serious shortage now but that the country faces a real challenge to supply a possible population of 275,000,000 by the year 2000.

Robert F. Tarrant of the northwest forest and range experiment station here, said more adequate soils information for the wildlands would result in a better job of resource management. There are millions of acres of forest land on which soils have not yet been classified, he said.

Senile Feline Dines On Corn, Meat, Peas

Decatur, Ill. — (U.P.) — Kitty Kat, a white Persian-Angora feline owned by Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Evans, is getting old and losing her teeth, but she can still eat corn on the cob.

Kitty Kat is 17 years old—four or five years past the normal life expectancy of a cat.

And recently she had a tooth pulled, without the benefit of an anesthetic. The veterinarian said Kitty Kat was too old to take an anesthetic.

However, Mrs. Evans said the family pet still eats ground beef, peas strained for babies, kidney, liver, cheese and corn on the cob. She doesn't like the commercial cat foods, Mrs. Evans said.

Kitty Kat also requires the freshest possible drinking water, Mrs. Evans said. The bath tub faucet in the Evans home has been adjusted to drip constantly for Kitty Kat's convenience.

Canada's Jobless Pay Equals That of U.S.

Chicago — (U.P.) — Canada's federal system of unemployment compensation is keeping pace with recent increases in state jobless pay benefits in the United States, according to a study by the Commerce Clearing House, national reporting authority on tax and business law.

Under a new law recently granted royal assent, Canadian workers who contribute to the unemployment compensations fund may receive benefits up to a maximum of \$30 a week during unemployment.

This compares with a national range of from \$22 to \$54 in the United States, with the average state payment about \$32 per week. In this country each state has its own program, and in most states only employers contribute to the fund.

So far this year, CCH said, about 30 states have raised their benefit payments an average of \$5 per week.

Pasco Youth Pleads Guilty To Two Charges

Pasco, Wash. — (U.P.) — Richard Petersen, 16, yesterday pled guilty to amended charges of second degree murder and manslaughter in connection with the fatal shooting here last April of Policemen Alva Jackson and of his father, P. H. Petersen.

He previously had been charged with first degree murder. He was on trial here when he entered his plea after a long deliberation between his attorneys and Prosecutor Roger Olson.

Dulles Will Discuss Mid-East Situation

Washington — (U.P.) — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said yesterday he expects to discuss the Middle East situation with Russian Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov at next week's Big Four foreign ministers meeting in Geneva.

Dulles noted at a news conference that he already has raised the question twice in discussions with Molotov.

The third time might bring more luck, he said.

Dulles also said it would be permissible for the Middle East situation to be placed formally on the Geneva agenda if all of the Big Four foreign ministers agree. But Dulles said he thought it more likely the matter would be discussed informally in private side talks.

Body of Man Found

Long Beach, Wash. — (U.P.) — James - Duree, Pacific county coroner, said yesterday that the badly decomposed body of a young man found last Saturday on Sand island in the Columbia estuary was that of Thomas F. Winfield, 36, Olympia, Wash.

Winfield, who was identified by his wife, Alyce, drowned while sport fishing near Sand island Sept. 2.

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Hurried Editor Drops Page One on Floor

Lakin, Kan. — (U.P.) — In a hurry to leave for a newspaper convention, Monte Canfield, editor of the weekly Lakin Independent, had an accident with the page one form he was carrying to the press. To his readers he explained:

"We poked our big fat belly through the middle of it and spilled the whole damn thing on the floor."

The staff helped pick up the pied type and put it back together. But there were 16 lines left over. These, at Canfield's departing decision, went at the bottom of the page, and a note to readers suggested they try to find where the lines should have been inserted.

"No prize will be given for the correct answer," the note added.

Russian Agriculture Tourist Named Minister

Moscow — (U.P.) — Vladimir Matsekich, who headed the Soviet agricultural delegation which visited the United States last summer, has been appointed minister of agriculture.

Matsekich was greatly impressed by American farming methods and his report on the American tour has been widely published in the Soviet Press. In his new post, he was expected to put into use some of the techniques he learned on the trip.

Winchell's Daughter, Husband Separate

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Mrs. Walter Winchell Von Dehn, daughter of newspaper columnist Walter Winchell, has separated from her husband of three months, Hyatt Robert Von Dehn, her attorney said yesterday.

Attorney Jerry Giesler said Mrs. Von Dehn planned no immediate divorce action but had retained him "to handle her matrimonial affairs."

Von Dehn is the former husband of singer Ginny Simms.
