Sprinkler of Lawn Hailed Into Court

Milwaukee—(U.P.)—Milwaukee, like many other cities, has a summer ordinance that says people on the even numbered side of the street may sprinkle their lawns one day, and those on the opposite the next day.

Lorenz O. Stammerger, did not believe his lawn was getting enough water, since it has not rained for eight days. So his 17-year-old son connected the sprinkler hose to the family's 2 1/2-ton air conditioning unit, instead of sending the used cooling water down a basement drain, it went out on the lawn. The flow was enough to wet a six-foot area around the sprinkler.

Three policemen stopped and told Stammerger he was violating a city ordinance. A lieutenant gave him a ticket.

After much confusion and consultation with city officials, the police decided Stammerger was breaking the law, even though using waste water. So a special court session was called, and the irate Stammerger agreed to appear.

The judge dismissed the case, saying that the ordinance was not intended to compel people to save waste water. He suggested that a phrase be added to the law to cover such cases.

Saratoga Springs, N. Y.—(U.P.)—The Delaware & Hudson Railroad has retired its last two wooden passenger cars. Their passing was mourned by commuters, who said the ancient cars may have creaked a little, but they were more comfortable and cooler than their steel replacements.
