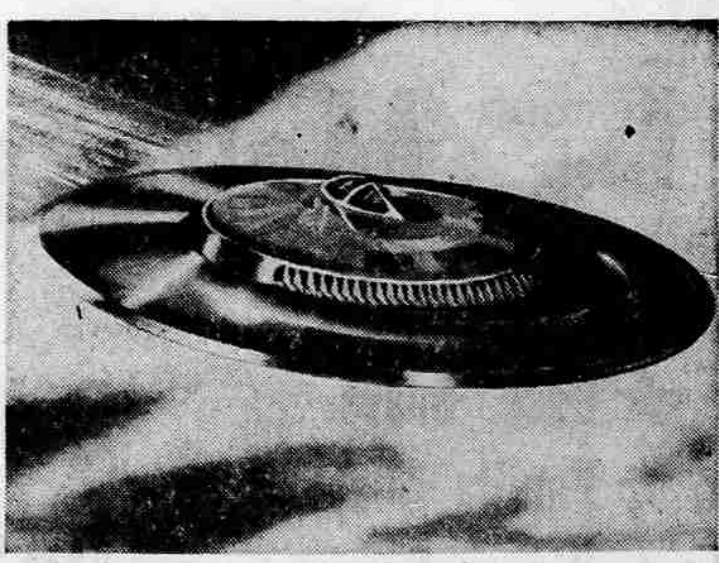
QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Riboflavin Deficiency
What causes corners of mouth to become wrinkled and fissured or cracked open and lips covered with a sort of skin... (J.E.)
Answer—Very likely riboflavin deficiency. To correct it you must consume not less than 1½ pints (three glasses) of milk, fresh, evaporated, dried, skim, certified or pasteurized, daily in addition to regular diet. If you will not or cannot do so, then eat cheese, whatever kind you like, every day. Also eat liver once or twice a week. Or supplement your regular diet with three 5-mg. riboflavin tablets daily for at least a month.

What Are You Doing Saturday Night?
