Walla Walla Prison Escape Try Thwarted

Walla Walla — (U.P.) — Three convicts, charged in connection with last July's riot at the state penitentiary here, attempted to break out of the prison early yesterday, Warden Lawrence Delmore Jr. said.

Cecil King, Kenneth George and Larry Olson sawed their way out of their individual cells with a saw blade, Delmore said. However, they were caught immediately by alert guards, searched and returned to new cells.

"Where they were going, I don't know," the warden said. "They still had to get out of the cell block and over the wall."

Delmore said the men put soap on the blade and because of the softness of the 19th century steel used in the construction of the ancient wing of the prison where the riot leaders are being held, they were undetected at first.
