A spokesman for seven touring Russian journalists on legalized gambling in Reno, Nev.: "If it is in your tradition, it is fine. Since the revolution we've had no gambling in Russia. It is not in the tradition of our people."

American novelist and Nobel Prize winner Ernest Hemingway on the awarding of this year's Nobel Prize for literature to Hallor K. Laxness: "He's a very good writer and deserved to win."

Donald E. Keyhoe, former Marine Corps officer and author of books on flying saucers, on an Air Force statement that flying saucers don't exist: "It is an insult to the hundreds of solid operators who have confirmed that the flying saucers are real objects, maneuvering at fantastic speeds under intelligent control."

He never offers to pay me back and I hesitate to remind him that he said he would pay me back when he got his next pay check."

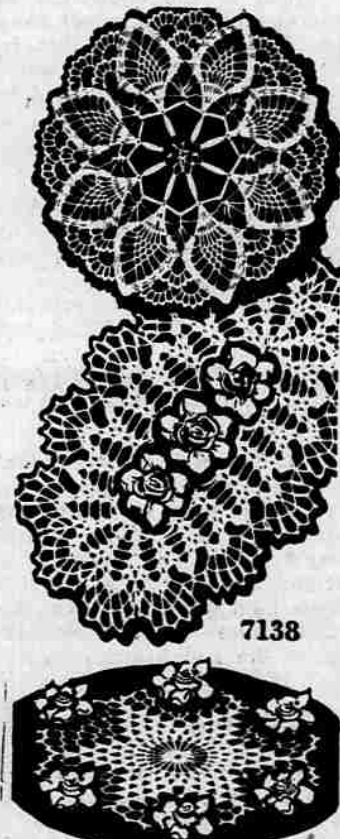

L.P.T. (A) I definitely think that you should ask this boy to return the money he borrowed from you and I hope you have kept an accurate record of the times and amounts you lent him so you can show him exactly what he owes you.

The chances are he would be both offended and angry if you asked him to return your money. But, do you want to continue friendship with a person who is unreliable and actually dishonest in his dealings with you? Promising to pay and then never doing so without giving

you an explanation would certainly suggest dishonesty on his part. You had better think twice before making any further plans to marry this boy, either now or later.
