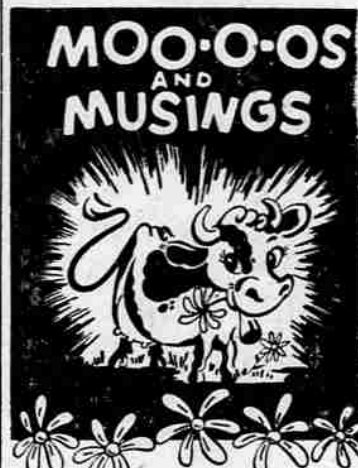
THE DANGEROUS AGE?

Six-Month Delay In Airport Program

Portland (U.P.)—A six-month delay in start of a \$10,000,000 improvement program at Portland International Airport has been revealed here by Port Manager John J. Winn Jr.

Winn said that by delaying the start from January, 1956, until July of next year the port could become eligible for some \$8,000,000 in federal aid. That would be equivalent to cost of the new terminal building alone. By starting construction in January, as originally planned, the port would lose about \$800,000 in federal aid, Winn said.

The full expenditure will go for land acquisition, grading, drainage, terminal, new runway and other expansion work. Construction of the terminal would take about 18 months.

The port has authority to issue bonds raising approximately \$2,000,000 per year without vote of the people. Winn estimated the terminal building would pay for itself in 30 years through rentals and other income.

Figures Compiled for Meat Inspection Plan

Salem (U.P.)—First figures compiled from the pilot program on compulsory meat inspection in the Salem area Saturday showed 1345 animals were slaughtered in the survey conducted in nine plants.

State Agriculture Director J. F. Short said findings were about normal for slaughtering operations but he added he does not have comparative data on a three-weeks program of this nature.

The pilot program, authorized by the department's division of animal industry, had its initial run in the Salem area. The nine plants under compulsory inspection from Sept. 26 through Oct. 13 were located in Salem, Silverton, Independence, Dallas, Amity, McMinnville, Willamina and Molalla.
