Governments Seek Private Forecasts

Chicago — (U.P.) — Local government bodies are turning to the use of private weather services, according to the American Public Works Association.

Mostly they contract for snow and ice forecasts so they will know when to send out snowplow or sanding crews, the association said. Some seek fog forecasts in order to set up signs reducing speed limits.

Other clients in the public service field are local transit companies that need to put storm control programs into operation.

The use of private weather services—by both business and government—largely has developed since the end of World War II.

7 Oregonians Killed in Crash Of UAL Airliner in Colorado

Portland — (U.P.) — Seven Oregonians and several other persons aboard here died last night in the flaming crash of a United Air Lines DC-6B airliner near Longmont, Colo., which took 44 lives.

Those from Oregon listed aboard the plane included: Mrs. J. W. Bunch, 60, Forest Grove; Mr. and Mrs. Horace B. Bynum, Sherwood; Mrs. Lewis L. McLain, 81, Portland; Dr. and Mrs. R. W. Van Valin, Newberg, and Miss Jacqueline Hands, a stewardess, who was raised in Eugene.

Also aboard the plane were Mr. and Mrs. V. V. Herman, Vancouver, Wash.

One of the passengers killed was Dr. Harold Sandstead, nationally known nutrition research expert, who was en route to address the sixth annual institute on the Far East and World Affairs at Oregon State college Nov. 3-5.

Dr. and Mrs. Van Valin were returning from a month's vacation in Philadelphia. He was a retired dentist. Their son, Herbert, Corvallis, was en route to Portland to meet his parents when he heard news of the crash on the radio.

Mrs. Bunch was returning from Denver where she had gone to attend a meeting of Methodist church officials.

Mr. and Mrs. Bynum were returning to their home in Sherwood after a trip to Amarillo, Tex., to visit his parents. He was a geologist for Sinclair Oil Company and his wife was expecting a baby. They only recently moved to Sherwood from Portland.

Nysa Merchants Alarmed Over Business Decline

Nysa — (U.P.) — Nysa merchants today expressed alarm at a 40-50 per cent drop in business as a result of publicity given this eastern Oregon town's polio epidemic.

At the same time, State Epidemiologist Dr. Samuel Osgood of Portland announced that "well over 600" persons were inoculated in an emergency program undertaken to halt a wave of polio.

Dr. Osgood said he was "well satisfied" with the special clinics set up to administer the vaccine, which was obtained in an emergency shipment from the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. Some 600 volunteers are helping with inoculations, he said.

Business Could Drop More

Merchant spokesmen said their volume of business could drop even more as a result of three photographs which appeared in an Ontario paper, showing a dead cat and a dead dog on top of uncovered garbage at the Nysa city dump.

Nysa City Manager Aubrey Middaugh, who said there was "no argument" that the dump was a "problem," said the area would be sprayed Thursday, and that a program to cover it with dirt would be started.

Middaugh pointed out that two separate sanitation studies of the Nysa area were being conducted, one an independent study by the Idaho Health Department, and the other by the Oregon Health Department.
