BLOOD VESSEL GRAFTS

At the recent meeting of the American Heart Association, a number of prominent surgeons spoke hopefully about the new technique of transplanting a piece of artery from a blood vessel bank to help someone who much needs more blood in his legs. There are three main types of persons who need these grafts. One is the person with the main artery to a leg so plugged-up that the leg is likely to become gangrenous—require amputation. Another person can have a blow-out in an artery—called an aneurysm. If not treated, this weak spot may eventually burst open. Today some of these aneurysms can be cut out and replaced with a graft.

Another person may have a cancer that has grown into one of the main arteries of the body. In the past, this has meant that nothing could be done. Today, the cancer and the artery can perhaps be removed together, and the defect replaced by a transplanted length of artery.

Diseased Gallbladder
At the recent meeting of the American Heart Association, my old friend, Dr. Thomas J. Dry, of the Mayo Clinic, reported that in the presence of a bad heart, a useful and rapid operator can usually remove a diseased gallbladder that is causing much pain. It is a curious fact that often, after such an operation, the patient's heart gets much better. He (or she) is able to do more than he could before. Dr. Dry based these conclusions on an analysis of the records of 100 patients with heart disease who underwent gallbladder operations at the Mayo Clinic in the years 1948 to 1953, and lived to get much better.

Excessive Hormones
In these days when so many persons, on general principles, take large amounts of hormones, it is well to note that at the recent meeting of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists, Dr. William B. Ober and colleagues, of the Boston Lying-in Hospital, reported that the taking of large amounts of progesterone or some other hormone by the mother can make changes, and possibly dangerous ones, in the sexual glands of her unborn child.

New Drug
At the recent meeting of the American Heart Association a new nerve-blocking drug which lowers high blood pressure, was described by Dr. John H. Moyer and his associates at Baylor University.

The new drug is known as Mecamylamine. Its actions are said to be more consistent and predictable than are those of some of the other powerful drugs of this type. It also has the great advantage that it is well absorbed from the digestive tract and hence can be taken by mouth. Some of the other drugs must be injected into the muscle.

Cancer of the Breast
At the recent meeting of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists, Drs. F. D. Speer and M. M. Black announced their discovery that, by searching through microscopic sections of a woman's breast cancer, and observing the ways in which the body was attacking the cancer with cells called histiocytes and lymphocytes, one can get a good idea of the patient's "prognosis," or future course. If it is found that the body is putting up a big fight against the bad cell, the outlook is favorable.

Employment of Epileptics
In England, because of the way in which medicine is now practiced, the government has records of all sick or disabled persons. In a report published in the Journal of the American

Medical Association, it is stated that recently the total number of epileptics on the register of disabled persons was 16,267. Of this number only 1,670 were unemployed. Some can work in practically any shop while some of those with the most frequent spells are provided with what is called "shelter employment" in Remploy Ltd., an organization that is providing work in special factories for the severely disabled. Over 400 epileptics are employed by this company.
