

# Army Ordered to Step Up Program of Germ Warfare

Washington—(U.P.)—The Army was under orders today to step up its program for germ and gas warfare.

Army Secretary Wilbur M. Brucker issued this order in approving a civilian advisory committee report urging that chemical, biological, and radiological warfare be planned a part of regular military planning.

The approved report, released Sunday night, also decried the public conception that such forms of warfare are "horrible in character" and said they should be recognized for their "unique potential."

**Appointment Proposed**  
Among other things, the committee proposed appointment of a top-level officer in the Chemical Corps to keep tabs on germ warfare developments and fit them into overall military planning. It also called for "aggressive" intelligence to discover what other nations are doing in the field.

"Recognition must be given to these weapons as having unique potential in warfare without associated destruction of facilities and the attendant problems of rehabilitation," the committee said.

"Recognition also must be given to the ability of these weapons to weaken the 'will to fight' of the enemy's military personnel and civilian population without attendant loss of lives or permanent injury."

The committee made clear its belief that an adequate arsenal of such weapons might remove any temptation for some future enemy to resort to germ warfare.

An Army announcement said Brucker had approved "implementation" of the report.

# Belief Increases That Ike Again Will Run for President

Washington—(U.P.)—It is six weeks now since President Eisenhower suffered a heart attack



and confidence is beginning to succeed despair in the cabinet.

There is a growing belief and talk among high ranking administration members that Mr. Eisenhower will run again.

This is most notable among some who recently visited the President. They came away with memory of a vigorous, healthy man capable of work.

A recent visitor summed it up this way:

"Why shouldn't the President run again? His policies are established. He's become accustomed to the presidential routine. More important, he has set up a staff organization to lift some of the burden."

"The job can be made even less difficult—so much less that Ike could find ample time for his Gettysburg farm."

"And there are two other factors: Might Not Like Retirement"

"First, a man who likely must cut down considerably on golf and fishing might find absolute retirement at Gettysburg less appealing than if the farm merely were a base from which to engage full blast in favorite sports.

"A second factor easily might put the greatest pressure on Ike to run again. It is the foreign situation now developing. Perhaps there will be a turn for the better before long. But, frankly, we don't see that coming. The President feels that his greatest competency is in the fields of defense and foreign relations. He might decide to try another term, even at some risk to his health, in the cause of peace."

So goes the argument for another term. Some may be wishful thinking. But it is remarkable how the point of view has changed here since the President was stricken Sept. 24.

All concerned agree that part of the decision lies with the President's doctors. If they say he safely could take it on, highly placed individuals here think he will. These and others make much of the fact there are many thousands of American men and women who survived heart attacks and still lead active and useful lives.

**Bets Against Second Term**  
But others close to Mr. Eisenhower believe he is through. One of these is a man who will make a small bet any time that the President will not run again. He was betting that way long before Mr. Eisenhower became ill.

Said he: "Nearly two years ago I became convinced that Ike would not take a second term. Here's what convinced me: The President was discussing politics and his own career in it. He squinted, smiled at a group of us and said: 'When I was in Paris, you came to me with arguments about what my duty was. All right. I went along with what you thought was my duty. Meanwhile he agreed to enter politics. Next time, gentlemen, don't come talking to me about duty. I'll make my own decision on that.'"

This friend said it was Mr. Eisenhower's way of telling them even then that he would quit after four years.

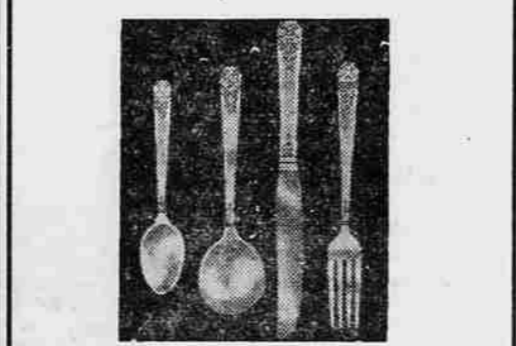
