Jack Benny Wins Federal Tax Suit

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Comedian Jack Benny, who rose to stardom with his characterization as the stingiest man in Hollywood, has won a \$1,000,000 tax fight with the government.

Benny's attorneys announced Sunday that the U.S. Tax Court has ruled in Benny's favor in a dispute with the Internal Revenue bureau over the sale in 1948 of Amusement Enterprises Inc. The Columbia Broadcasting System bought the corporation, in which Benny was principal stockholder, for \$2,260,000. Benny's radio programs were produced by the corporation.

Benny paid a 25 per cent capital gains tax on his share of the sale. The government claimed he should have paid a 75 per cent personal income tax. The difference amounted to \$1,000,000.
