Magsaysay-Backed Candidates Leading

Manila — (U.P.) — Candidates of President Ramon Magsaysay's pro-American Nacionalista party led today in seven of the nine senatorial races at stake and Magsaysay's bitterest opponent charged he was being cheated.

The fraud charges were made by Sen. Carlo M. Recto, a renegade Nacionalista senator who appeared on the opposition Liberal Party slate as a "guest candidate" after he broke with Magsaysay in a fiery dispute over foreign policy.

Recto said he was far down in the list of probable winners because pro-administration officers were putting out "misleading" partial election returns.

Ames, Iowa — (U.P.) — A final count showed today that Mayor James P. Lawlor got all but one of the votes cast in Tuesday's municipal election.

The holdout vote was a write-in for former President Truman.

Appeals Court Blocks Move by Government

Washington — (U.P.) — The U.S. Court of Appeals today blocked the government's effort to strip the International Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers Ind. of collective bargaining and privileges under the Taft-Hartley Act.

The three-judge court unanimously reaffirmed a previous decision that the National Labor Relations Board cannot take such action against a union because an officer files a false non-Communist affidavit.
