

Medford Has Invitation To Join Northwest Pro Baseball Circuit

Medford has been invited to join the Northwest professional baseball league, it was learned here over the week end. It is a Class B circuit and at present includes Spokane, Tri-City and Yakima in Washington; Lewiston, Ida., and Salem and Eugene in Oregon.

The invitation was extended to local baseball interests by Babe Hollingberry, president of the league.

It was also learned that a valley business firm has offered to underwrite about half of the expenses involved in fielding a team in the league if underwriting can be found for the balance. The firm preferred not to have its name disclosed at this time.

A meeting of interested persons has been called for Monday, Nov. 21, at 8 p.m. at the Holland hotel to discuss the matter and to see if some decision can be reached on underwriting the balance necessary to operate a club.

Could Use Fairgrounds

Possibility of using the present baseball field at the Fairgrounds park also will enter into the discussion and a decision will be reached.

Odds Against Rehiring of C. Goodwin

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Claire V. Goodwin comes up for reappointment as president of the Pacific Coast League late this month, and the odds are against him, the United Press has learned from a source close to the PCL.

The fact that Goodwin was middleman in two abortive efforts to find a buyer for the financially-stricken San Francisco Seals was tabbed by the source as reason for some league directors as being dissatisfied.

Goodwin or the directors can terminate his "working agreement" with the league anytime and matters will come to a showdown at the annual minor league meeting in Columbus, O., Nov. 28. Among clubs believed to be opposed to retaining the retired super-market executive are Los Angeles, Portland, Seattle and Hollywood.

Deals Collapse

The source said there was no indication who might succeed him.

Jerry Donovan, executive secretary of the league and president of the Class C California league, doesn't "have a big enough name for the directors," the source added. "They want to get somebody like General MacArthur."
