### Turkey Planned-Overs

It takes a good-sized family or dinner party to finish-up a turkey. Plan ahead how you are going to use the excess and have the other ingredients on hand. This way you'll avoid any last minute "desperation" recipes.

### Turkey Chow Mein

For those who like the oriental influence in cooking, this will make a fine meal. Serve with plenty of fluffy hot rice.

- 1 green pepper cut in strips
- 2 cups celery sliced
- 1 cup thinly sliced onions
- 1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms or 1 4-ounce can mushroom slices
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 cups turkey stock
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch

3 cups bite-size pieces turkey  
1 No. 2 can bean sprouts or 1 can mixed Chinese vegetables  
3 tablespoons soy sauce  
Toasted almonds, optional

Saute green pepper, celery, onions and mushrooms in the butter for five minutes or until lightly brown. Sprinkle cornstarch over all and stir until well blended. Gradually add turkey stock, stirring constantly, bring to a boil. When thickened, add salt, pepper, cut-up turkey, soy sauce and bean sprouts or Chinese vegetables. Serve with or over hot rice or Chinese noodles. Slivered toasted almonds may be sprinkled on top.

### Turkey Salad

This may not sound unusual, but it is difficult to improve on it for very good eating. Combine two cups bite-size turkey pieces, 1 1/2 cups chopped celery, four chopped hard-cooked eggs, one-fourth cup chopped pimiento, one-half teaspoon salt, one-half teaspoon Worcestershire sauce and one cup mayonnaise in order given. Mix thoroughly. Garnish with greens.

### Turkey Rice or Noodle Soup

Simplicity itself is this turkey soup. Break turkey carcass down to soup pan size. Place in pan, barely cover with water. Add salt, pepper, one bay leaf, one large onion cut in pieces, two tablespoons chopped parsley, and, if you have celery leaves or even dried celery stalks, cut and add them too. Let simmer 1 1/2 to two hours, stirring occasionally. Strain. Add two cups cooked rice or cooked fine egg noodles for each four cups stock. Re-heat and serve.

### Lemon Snow with Custard Sauce

Tart-flavored, light-textured desserts are frequently just the right "light-ending" to a heavy holiday meal. This lemon-snow is a real "goodie."

1 envelope unflavored gelatin  
1/4 cup cold water  
1 cup boiling water  
1 cup sugar  
1/3 cup bottled or fresh lemon juice  
3 egg whites, beaten stiff

Soften gelatin in cold water five minutes. Add boiling water and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add sugar and lemon juice. Cool until thick enough to hold the mark of a spoon. Beat until frothy. Add stiffly beaten egg whites and continue beating until mixture holds its shape. Pile into chilled sherbet glasses and serve with this:

**Custard Sauce**  
3 egg yolks  
2 tablespoons sugar  
Dash salt  
1 cup milk, scalded  
1/4 teaspoon vanilla

In a double boiler or small saucepan, beat egg yolks slightly with a fork. Add sugar and salt. Add milk gradually, stirring constantly. Cook over hot water or very low flame, until stirring constantly, until mixture coats spoon. Chill and add vanilla. Note: If custard curdles from over-cooking, beat with rotary beater to restore smoothness.

### Stuffed Olive Have Eye and Taste Appeal

Garnishes often make the difference between "just a meal" and a meal that is something special. Pimiento-stuffed green olives as a garnish give a touch of distinctive elegance when used in ways like these:

Top hamburger patties with olive slices.

Use olive slices to decorate molded salads and canapés.

Arrange olives kabob-style with pickled onions and Swiss cheese cubes for a delicious addition to the appetizer tray.

Sprinkle small olive wedges over cabbage slaw to add flavor, texture and color.

Finely chop olives for an excellent hot or cold soup garnish.

Add new interest to meat, fish and vegetable sauces by adding chopped olives, or sprinkle on top just before serving.

## Dr. Salk Named As Man of Year

New York — (U.P.) — The nation's radio news executive have named Dr. Jonas Salk as the man of the year. Princess Margaret was voted the most newsworthy woman of the year.

They made their selections in a poll conducted by United Press among its almost 1,700 radio news wire clients.

President Eisenhower, who has won the poll in three previous years, ran Dr. Salk a close second. Konrad Adenauer was third and Adlai Stevenson fourth.

Princess Margaret dominated the field in the voting in the women's field. Clare Boothe Luce, the U.S. Ambassador to Italy, was second with one-sixth the votes polled by Margaret. Mrs. Eisenhower, who won the poll two years ago, was third.

Sizable votes also were polled by Oveta Culp Hobby, former secretary of health, education and welfare; Florence Chadwick, who established a new channel swim record during the year, and Academy Award winner Grace Kelly.

One news editor voted for Hurricane Connie.

## Bank Cashier Feared Kidnaped With \$16,000 Cash

Detroit — (U.P.) — Police and FBI agents intensified a search for a missing Minnesota bank cashier today who was believed to have been kidnaped with nearly \$16,000 in bank funds.

Kenneth Lindbergh, 44-year-old cashier at the Thief River Falls Northern State Bank, disappeared last Saturday. Police said he took with him \$14,000 in blank traveler's checks and \$1850 in silver dollars which weighed more than 100 pounds.

Police said they believed Lindbergh was kidnaped because he had access to the bank vault and would not have taken the bulky load of silver dollars with him by choice.

FBI agents said a man who was not Lindbergh deposited \$6000 worth of the checks in the Detroit Bank last Monday and later tried to cash a \$275 check at a downtown department store. Suspicious bank officials stopped payment on all checks drawn on the account.

Police here said Minnesota authorities told them a man went to the bank Saturday to see Lind-

bergh on a real estate transaction and was seen talking with the cashier after the bank closed.

The FBI said it has issued a warrant for a man identified as Charles D. Kenwell. They said Kenwell, believed to be from Philadelphia, was seen driving a car with Minnesota license plates here similar to the car owned by Lindbergh.

## Pastor Takes Bride Aboard Fishing Boat

At Sea Off Bridlington, England — (U.P.) — A Finnish pastor and his bride were married in a fishing boat six miles at sea today because the fellow pastor who performed the ceremony was not authorized to marry Finns in Britain.

The Rev. Jorma Lothivuori, Finnish pastor in London, married Pastor Neils Erick Palmein, Finnish pastor at Hull, and Miss Toini Turunen aboard the vessel just outside of British territorial waters.

Officials of the Minnesota bank told police Lindbergh had been in their employ for 10 years and was completely trustworthy. They said he is married and has four children.

Lindbergh may have been kidnaped by a bandit who tried to take more money from the bank but may have been foiled by a time-clock mechanism on the main safe, police said.

## California Waters To Get Trout Supply

Sacramento, Calif. — (U.P.) — Some 9,000,000 rainbow trout, the largest number of fish of catchable size ever to be planted in California lakes and streams and being distributed now by the State Department of Fish and Game.

During the next six months some 1,500,000 pounds of trout will find their way into California waters and eventually into the creels of anglers all over the state.

The fish and game men will also plant about 13,000,000 fingerlings in the mountain lakes in remote areas by air, and in a few instances where the country is

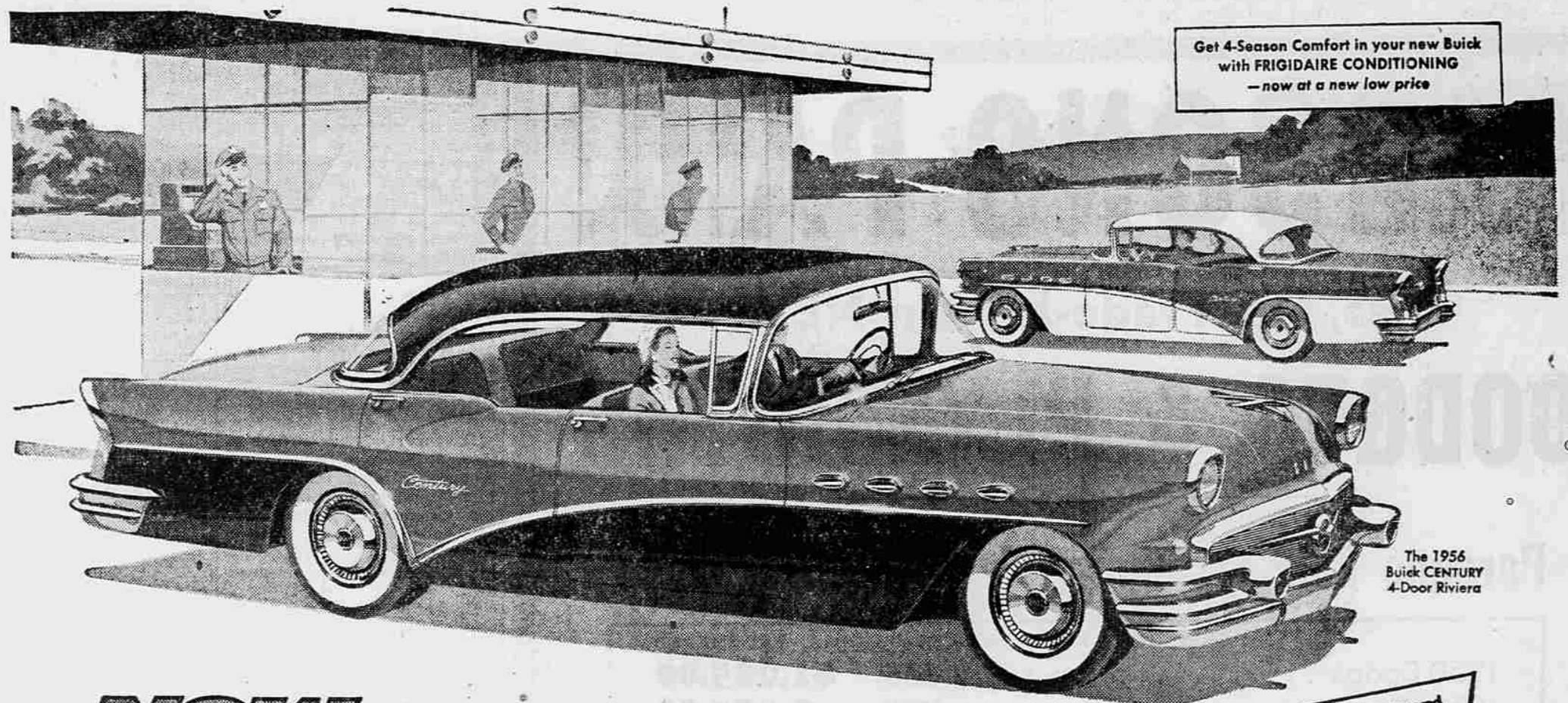
