

Ashland Radio Company Named

Ashland — Rogue Broadcasters, Inc., operator of radio station KWIN, has been named defendant in a breach of contract suit filed in federal court in Portland Monday.

Plaintiff in the suit is Associated Press. The news service firm seeks \$5,775 in damages it claims due because the broadcasting company terminated a contract for news service. The complaint states that the service was terminated in April, and that the station was \$1,592 in arrears for news service at that time. Associated Press maintains that the contract called for such service until 1958.

Bulganin, Khrushchev Arrive in New Delhi

New Delhi, India — (U.P.) — Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Communist party boss Nikita S. Khrushchev arrived here today for a state visit hailed by Moscow as one that will cement friendly collaboration between Russia and India.

The two Soviet leaders arrived in brilliant sunshine aboard a Soviet IL14 aircraft and were greeted by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru and Indian Vice-President Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, former Indian ambassador to Russia.

The Russians, who also will tour Burma and Afghanistan, were greeted by the roars of a crowd of 20,000. An estimated 130,000 lined the route to the city from the Indian Air Force station at Palam airport to watch the Russians pass by in a gleaming new Cadillac convertible.

Corporation Profits Expected To Set Mark

Washington — (U.P.) — The government reported today that corporation profits are headed for a new all time high. In contrast, farmers' net income this year will be about 10 per cent below last year.

The corporation profit estimate came from President Eisenhower's Council of Economic Advisors. It boomed administration hopes for balancing the federal budget and cutting taxes in 1956.

For the first nine months of this year, corporation profits were rocketing along at an annual rate of \$42,600,000,000.

But the decline in farm income emphasized the administration's difficulties with a problem that has become about the biggest issue now in the coming presidential election campaign.

Kefauver Supporters Deny Adlai Forging Lead for Nomination

Chicago — (U.P.) — Backers of Sen. Estes Kefauver today denied that Adlai E. Stevenson is forging a commanding lead for the 1956 Democratic presidential nomination.

A. Bradley Eben, convention manager in Kefauver's unsuccessful bid for the 1952 nomination, said Stevenson's strategists "are trying to create the atmosphere of a stampede."

"He's not nearly as strong as they pretend him to be and I believe he can be caught," Eben said. "That is, if he is in front — nobody has made an effort to catch him yet."

Eben, a Chicago lawyer, was interviewed in a hotel suite engaged as headquarters for the "Kefauver Planning Committee" during the three-day meeting of national Democratic leaders here.

Kefauver and New York Gov. Averell Harriman, another possible candidate for the presidential nomination, both were due to arrive late today for the political doings.

Leaders To Speak
Kefauver, Harriman, Stevenson and former President Truman will address a 100-a-plate

dinner meeting Saturday night. Eben, chairman of the Kefauver committee, said the group was "ready to spring into action when and if" the Tennessee announces he is a candidate. The lawyer said he expects Kefauver to make his decision known "within 30 days."

He predicted that "if Estes runs for the nomination he will get it, because all elements of the party will ultimately realize, if they are not now aware of it, that he is the candidate who would be the surest to defeat any Republican."

In a one-day meeting Thursday, the national committee ruled out any "loyalty oath" for delegates to next year's nominating convention. It decided to rely on state organizations to send delegates of "good faith" and on existing rules to keep out "notorious people."

Mitchell Draws Rules
The approved set of rules was drawn up by a special committee headed by Stephen A. Mitchell, former national chairman. He made it plain that he considered Gov. Allen Shivers of Texas among the "notorious people."

Shivers, who bolted the party ticket in 1952, said in Austin, Tex., that his right to attend the convention probably will be challenged by a "bunch of wild-eyed pinks." He also implied he will support President Eisenhower again if he should seek reelection on the GOP ticket.

The national committee also named three new vice-chairmen, all of them regarded as pro-Stevenson. They are Sen. Mike Mansfield of Montana, Rep. Hale Boggs of Louisiana, and Gov. Robert Meyner of New Jersey.

Japan Protests ROK Order To Shoot Ships

Tokyo — (U.P.) — Japan protested today to the Republic of South Korea against its orders to fire on Japanese ships sailing near Korean shores.

Vice-Foreign Minister Seimitsu Kadowaki called Korean Minister Kim Yong Shi to his office and told Kim Japan takes a "grave view" of the order issued by the ROK military joint chiefs of staff.

In a written statement yesterday, the Korean military staff said ROK patrol craft will fire upon and sink "if necessary" Japanese fishing vessels that cross inside Korea's disputed Rhee fishery line.

Kadowaki told him Japan did recognize the 60-mile off-shore line set by Korean President Syngman Rhee. He warned that Korea must assume full responsibility if any Japanese vessels are attacked.

Portland — (U.P.) — The Corps of Engineers North Pacific division has turned thumbs down on proposed flood control projects on the Siuslaw and Nestucca rivers on the Oregon coast.

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
