Adlai Supporters To Meet in Frisco To Plan Campaign

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Northern California supporters of Adlai E. Stevenson for the Democratic presidential nomination will meet here Dec. 2 to plan for the state primary election campaign, it was announced Saturday.

Stevenson's supporters from the 50 northern counties will meet at the Fairmont hotel to work out a "hard-hitting drive to put California in Stevenson's column" at next year's Democratic party convention in Chicago.

Chairman Named
William H. Orrick Jr., San Francisco attorney will preside as temporary chairman. The conference was called by Attorney General Edmund G. Brown, Congressman Clair Engle and Democratic party officials "acting as individuals."

The latter included Roger Kent of San Francisco, northern chairman of the Democratic State Central committee, and Lon Cranston of Los Altos, chairman of the Democratic county.

They are collaborating with Mrs. Elizabeth Snyder of Los Angeles, chairman of the Democratic State Central committee, and Paul Ziffren of Los Angeles, Democratic national committeeman, who are arranging a similar conference for Los Angeles at a later date.
