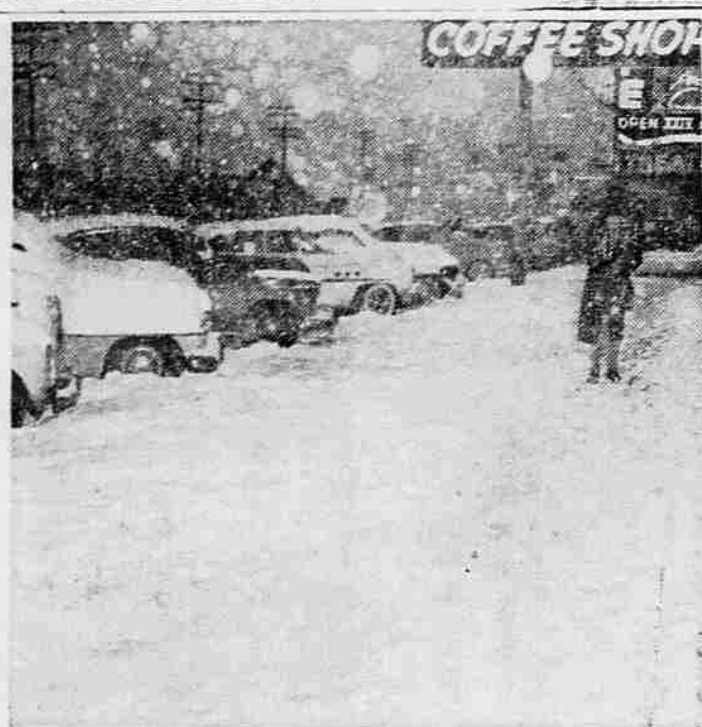

Basketball season is well underway in Jacksonville school with 26 boys turning out for practice and others trying out for the junior varsity team.

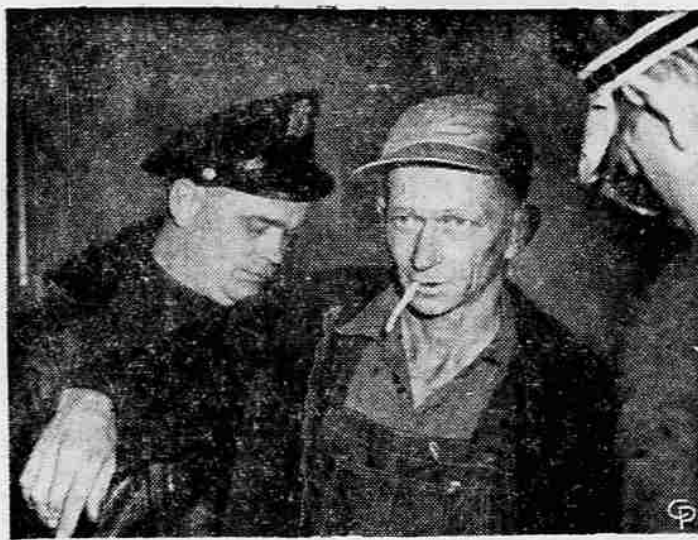

## Parish Mission Starts Nov. 27 At Sacred Heart

The Very Rev. Nicolas Deis, pastor of Sacred Heart Catholic church in Medford, announced Saturday that a parish mission would be held at the church from Sunday, Nov. 27 to Sunday, Dec. 4.

The mission will be opened formally at the 9:30 a.m. mass on Sunday, Nov. 27, and a special introductory sermon will be given at all masses that day.

During the period of the Mission, evening services will be conducted at 7:30 p.m., the feature of which will be a series of sermons on the fundamental facts of Christianity and the spiritual life. These services will also include the Way of the Cross, traditional Catholic hymns and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

One week days, short instructions will be given after the 6:30 and 8 a.m. masses.

The preachers of the Mission, Fr. Kaunte Horack, C.P. and Fr. Basil Killoran, C.P. are members of the Passionist order, one of the Missionary Orders of the Catholic church. They have conducted missions in cities of the Pacific coast and come to Sacred Heart church by the special arrangement of the pastor, the Very Rev. Deis.

The exercises of the mission, particularly the evening conferences are open to Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

## City Gets Oil Boom; Water Still Missing

Fredonia, Ky. — (U.P.) — This small town in western Kentucky badly needs a city waterworks, so the Fredonia Civic club got busy.

The club quickly collected \$200 and hired Al Taylor of Princeton, Ky., to drill a well. At 120 feet, Taylor found a small vein of water, but not enough to supply the town, so he kept on drilling. At 225 feet, he pulled out the bit — and found it covered with oil.

Another 10 feet down, and the drill still came up slick with oil. Two Illinois oilmen who happened to be driving by stopped and after looking over the situation, agreed that Fredonia had an oil well.

Experts say the pool is probably a shallow one, but a small-scale oil boom has started in the vicinity anyway.

The only trouble is — Fredonia still hasn't a waterworks.

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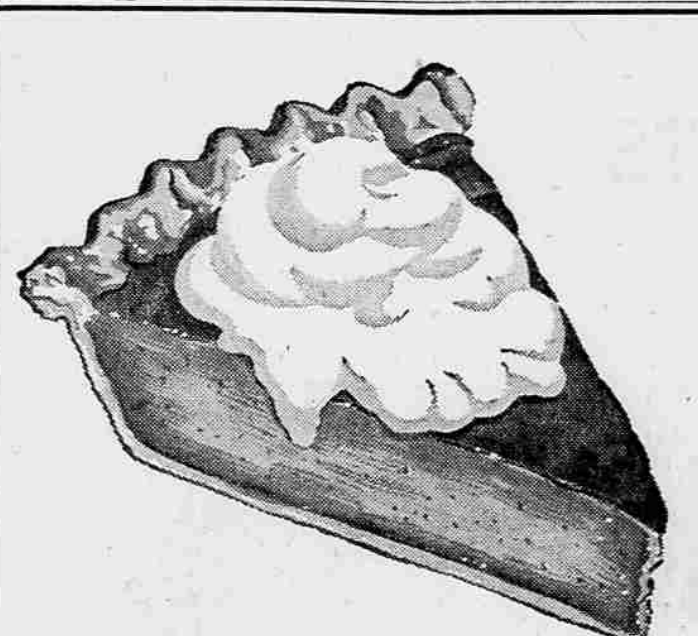
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
