Or, when the family sees how unhappy the mother is in the hospital, they may regret that they committed her, and then they will take her home. They may say that committing her was not a good solution for the problem; but what a good solution would be, they cannot guess. They may try to get the mother of a r a d i o beamed from a nearby house. They may try to get a psychiatrist to come to the house to see her, and will be angry when he says he never makes calls. Actually, if he were to come out, there would be little that he could do because one can rarely do much to change the mental workings of a person who "knows" that people are plotting against him. He will answer, "You just do not understand."

They think some mean person is forcing their mind to work in a certain way, or some enemy is planning to do them harm. Occasionally, an old man who is mentally disturbed will attack the wholly innocent neighbor whom he blames for all of his troubles. Sometimes a paranoiac will think that there is an organization in this country, the sole purpose of which is to annoy him (or her). Often an old lady will complain that she is being constantly called to the phone by some malevolent person—her enemy—who just says, "Wrong number," and hangs up! The patient's daughter may tell me that actually the phone had hardly rung twice all day. Often a suspicious person will take all of his money out of the bank because he doesn't trust anyone. He will hide it around his place, sometimes so thoroughly that it is never found again. Oftentimes a thief learns that an old person keeps large sums of money in the house, and then he comes and gets it. Every day newspapers tell of such cases.

Oftentimes if one talks to the family, one learns that the patient has always been suspicious, from childhood onward. I remember such a woman who never would allow anyone beside the family to come into her house. Even her children were not allowed to bring playmates into the yard. Sometimes the problem of caring for an older woman who has become suspicious becomes acute because she fails to recognize the daughter who has come home to take care of her. She may say to the rest of the family, "Get that woman out of here. I don't like her hanging around!" Sometimes the family decides that the mother had better be committed, but then, in court, the old lady appears so perfectly sane that the judge suspects the family of trying to railroad her into a mental hospital. Or, when the old lady gets to the hospital, she behaves so well that the superintendent

Secret Guided Missile Tests Cause of Feud

Washington—(AP)—The Army and Air Force are feuding over the results of secret guided missile tests in which the Army's Nike duelled the Air Force's Matador. The tests were held to determine the effectiveness of the 1,600-mile-an-hour Nike against modern jet bombers. That much-publicized missile was pitted against an Air Force Matador jet bomber missile with a speed of 600 miles an hour. The Nike knocked down at least one Matador—two by Army claims—but missed on several other shots in aerial duels last month at White Sands, N.M., proving grounds. The Matador was chosen as the target because it is, in effect a pilotless fighter-bomber with the speed but not the size of present jet bombers. But the inconclusiveness of the tests only added new fire to a long-standing controversy between the two services.
