Approve Seminary For Kansas City

The Woman's division of Christian service of the Methodist church is one of several Methodist organizations which this fall have approved the establishment of a theological school in Kansas City, Mo.

The executive committee of the Woman's division in New York recently voted that the Methodist women's organization would "look with favor" on a proposal for a seminary in connection with the National college for Christian workers, an institution of the Woman's division. The action was taken upon recommendation of the department of work in home fields.

Two Methodist conferences in Missouri, the St. Louis and the Southwest Missouri, have endorsed a seminary for Kansas City.

The executive committee also approved the employment of a social worker in Colorado Springs, Colo., the site of the new Air Force academy, saying the area was strategic for church development because of the expected population boom.
