### Auburn Has Three on UP SE All-Star

Atlanta—(U.P.)—Auburn dominated the 1955 United Press All-Southeastern Conference football team today by placing three players, but Florida center Steve Delatorre was the outstanding individual selection.  
Auburn won first-team berths with tackle Frank D'Agostino, half back Bob James and full-back Joe Childress.  
Delatorre won the top spot by collecting the most points from southeastern sports writers. Delatorre won 380 of a possible 420 to shade guard Scott Suber of Mississippi State, who got 370 points.  
LSU Places  
Two rugged Louisiana State linemen, end Joe Tuminello and tackle Earl Leggett, won berths beside D'Agostino, Leggett and Delatorre. The line is rounded out by Franklin Brooks of Georgia Tech and end Howie Schnelberger of Kentucky.  
In the backfield with James and Childress, Mississippi's aerial artist, Eagle Day, was selected at quarterback and triple-threat John Majors of Tennessee at halfback.

A 21-yard field goal by Fred Cone and a five-yard touchdown pass from Tobin Rote to Gary Knafelc gave Green Bay a short-lived lead.  
But then came the disastrous second quarter. A Packer fumble set up Detroit's first touchdown on a three-yard pass from Bobby Layne to Lew Carpenter. Doak Walker's second field goal attempt was successful.  
Carpenter broke through the right side for a 49-yard scoring run that put Detroit ahead in the final quarter. The Lions clinched it a few minutes later on one of the weirdest plays of the season.  
Rote, holding for a 50-yard field goal attempt, fumbled the pass from center. He tried to run, but was met by a swarm of defense-men and tossed the ball to Cone. Cone couldn't hold it either. Sherwin Sonny Gandee picked it up and ran 48 yards for Detroit's final score.  
The Lions and Packers rest Sunday while the Chicago Bears and Cardinals meet in an intra-city battle. Baltimore hosts San Francisco, the Cleveland Browns visit the New York Giants, the Rams play at Philadelphia and the Pittsburgh Steelers entertain the Washington Redskins.

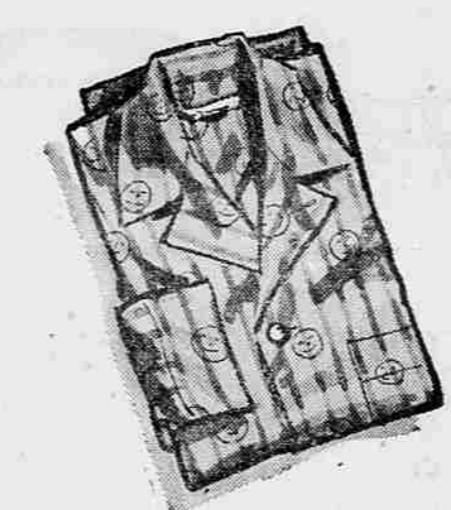

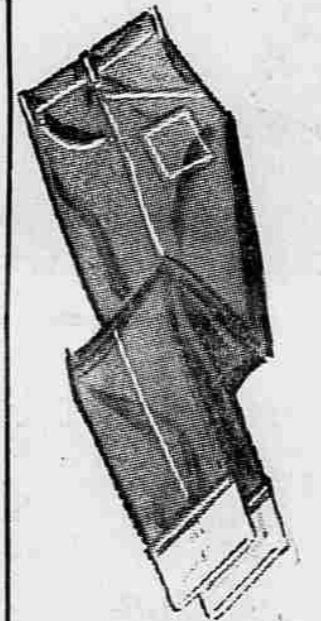
