Mendes-France Plans Two Speeches in U.S.

Paris—(U.P.)—Former Premier Pierre Mendes-France will fly to the United States next week to speak in New York and Louisville. It was announced today.

He accepted an invitation to make a foreign policy speech with emphasis on North Africa at Louisville University Dec. 2. Mendes-France also will speak before the Weissman Institute in New York on the relationship between science and politics.

The former Premier, currently embroiled with Premier Edgar Faure in a struggle for power, will fly to New York Nov. 29, on a trip that will take about one week.

He also plans to confer with UN Secretary general Dag Hammarskjold. He will not visit Washington.
